Busy times at Parkol

The remarkable degree with which Whitby boatbuilders Parkol Marine Engineering have developed in the last ten years was highlighted last week when work was being carried out simultaneously on four separate 26m vessels, reports **David Linkie**.

Approaching the first anniversary of her launch at Whitby, the 26m pair seiner Guiding Star following her 18-month old sistership Our Lass III onto Parkol's dry-dock for routine maintenance work and hull repainting.

Less than 10m away from Guiding Star, fitting out and machinery installation work on two contrasting types of new builds scheduled to be lifted into the River Esk in the early summer, continued to progress well under cover

The vessels currently under construction are a 26m whitefish trawler for Yell skipper Michael Henderson, together with partners Mark Hoseason and Lindsay Inkster of the Guardian Angell Fishing Company Ltd., and a 27m motor yacht built in the style of the iconic 1950's American coastal naval tugs for Whitby Yachts LLP.

Fabrication is also scheduled to commence in the coming weeks of a 14.95m vivier crabber for Brown and Bright Shellfish Ltd of Brixham.

Guiding Star was scheduled to come off the dry-dock at the beginning of this week and was to be replaced with the 22.6m Newlyn netter Governik of Ladram PZ 5, which steamed to North Yorkshire from Cornwall last weekend.
