drug testing

In the 2018 Muskegon County Business Survey, employers stated that, of the job applicants testing positive, they were more likely to test positive for Marijuana, compared to other drugs.



compensation

Employees can make more (\$20+ per hour) if they can pass a drug test vs. minimum wage for jobs that do not test their employees.



employment pool

4 out of 5 people caught testing positive on a drug test are fired. Even with a medical marijuana card, employees can still be fired for testing positive.

What you might do if you come to work high:

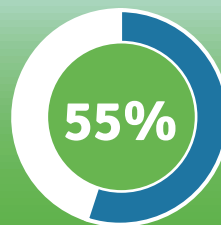
- Seem anxious

- Fail a drug test



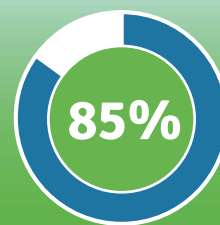
