*Use of topic based books as a stimulus for English work*

**Reading** - Develop phonics until decoding secure, read common suffixes, read and re-read phonic-appropriate books, read common 'exception' words, discuss and express views about fiction, non-fiction and poetry, become familiar with and retell stories, ask and answer questions; make predictions, begin to make inferences

**Writing** - Spell by segmenting into phonemes, learn to spell common 'exception' words, spell using common suffixes, etc., use appropriate size letters and spaces, develop positive attitude and stamina for writing, begin to plan ideas for writing, record ideas sentence-by-sentence, make simple additions and changes after proof-reading

**Grammar** - Use . ! ? , and ' , use simple conjunctions, begin to expand noun phrases, use some features of Standard English

**Speaking & Listening** - Articulate and Justify answers, initiate and respond to comments. use spoken language to develop understanding
