## **Message from the Headteacher**

Dear Parents,

Last Friday Comic Relief Day raised £331.03. What a fantastic result! The Glow Disco was also a resounding success. Teachers who had stayed on the evening were full of comments at how well the children enjoyed themselves. So a big, big thank you for your generosity for Comic Relief and to the PTA for organising the disco.

The week started with previously laid plans coming to fruition. On Monday Year 1 children went to Warwick Castle. I have to admit I was concerned about the weather after last weekend with the gales and lashing rain. I didn't need to, they had a wonderful day. The Year 5 children visited the Ashmolean museum in Oxford. They also had a good day and I didn't worry about them – they were inside and they are big and tough anyway.

During the week, some parents also had a trip! The PTA organised a visit to see the Bodyguard musical at the Milton Keynes theatre. Another resounding success. The PTA have also been sorting out a new uniform provider after the company used previously ceased trading. They conducted live experiments, the sort that are not always possible in a full class of 30 during normal lessons. Details of this will be coming out next week.

## **EYFS**

We started the week with the Julia Donaldson story Zog. The children then made their own fire breathing Zog dragon using a cylinder. We have been learning the names of 3D shapes and the language to describe them: faces, edges, vertices. Not to be confused with properties of 2D shapes: sides and corners. We followed this up with the sequel story: Zog and the Flying Doctors. All the characters in the story help other people and we are using this to focus on the positive qualities that we notice in our friends in school. The children are continuing to make progress with their phonic and are trying to use these sounds in their writing.

If you come into school to drop your child off you may have noticed our display of photos of the children learning through play. We have added some assessment statements as well. Alongside the photos is a Donation Station. We will use this space to let you know about some items you can bring in to help us resource the children's learning activities. At the moment we would like some more junk modelling materials and some egg boxes. Many thanks for the donations so far.

#### CLASS 1


