

Pancho's Pillowcase Evacuation Practice

1



Use the biggest pillowcase you have. Roll the top down to make a cuff- this makes it easier to hold onto, and easier to get the pet in.

2



Check it out... there might be treats inside! It's a good idea to make it a game. Works great with dogs, and most cats.

You might want to pull on a sweatshirt or jacket to keep from getting scratched. Move calmly but firmly. Distract your pet with some treats!

Complete this move quickly

Tying things up: Grasp the corners, making sure you have enough to tie a secure knot.

Snug as a bug in a rug.

8



Out the door! Cat's in the bag. I've got his Ready-kit and mine is already in the car.

A complete kitty pillowcase package. He's safe and secure, and you can keep him from jumping out of the car. This is not a long-trip option. But, it's a really good way to get small pets safely into the car and to the emergency shelter, or wherever you can transfer him to a crate or cage. Make sure that when transferring your pet, you do this in a small room, with door closed. A quiet place, where you can provide some calming reassurance will feel good to both of you!
