2020 SUMMER CAMP SCHEDULE

Session One

6/8-6/12: Playground Connoisseur

This is always a big hit with campers! Playgrounds around the city await our exploring adventures. We will compare and contrast, review and report about the best and the not-so-best places a kid can play in our city.

6/15 to 6/19: Make Your Move(ie)

Campers will learn the basics of videography and making their own movies. From start to finish, they will plan and shoot (including lighting), then dump and edit, add graphics, images, sound and credits. Render your story!

6/22 to 6/26: Footprints and Flight

This week of camp is exploring animal tracks, while studying indigenous birds of Indiana. We will include bird bingo and art projects which accompany our findings.

6/29 to 7/3: Build It!

Campers will discover how different kinds of structures are built. They will look at various types of dwellings humans have used throughout history, and the fundamentals of constructing a home. Some notable examples will be shared, and materials will be provided for campers to construct their own.

7/6 to 7/10: Puppets in Motion

It's showtime! We begin with making different types of puppets, developing characters, writing scripts, and setting up our theater. Then, it's go time.... our puppets come to life in a live showcase.

Session Two

7/14 to 7/17: Animals in Our World

This week we will learn about the animals we share our world with, particularly in Indiana. Our adventures will lead us through nature walks and centers to observe and understand the creatures among us.

7/20 to 7/24: Sports Week

This whole week is dedicated to playing sports and learning the rules of a variety of games. Campers will also find out what sports are played in different parts of the world. Our main focus will be playing and moving and winning and learning. Let's play!

7/27 to 7/31: Get Your Game On

A favorite for many campers! we will play an array of games, including cards, dice, board, and video games. This is a gaming extravaganza. Get your game on!

8/3 to 8/7: The Art of Junk

Yes, junk art is here. Campers will re-purpose recycling materials to create sculptures, structures, and musical instruments. Directly from their imaginations, they will create truly original art objects.

8/10 to 8/14: Arts and Entertainment

Together, campers will explore the basics of theater, film, and television, and the history of entertainment in American culture. We may adventure to a museum, take in a movie, view a documentary, and/or watch a live band perform.
