POSITION DESCRIPTION

Pesticide Applicator

The following examples of duties and responsibilities illustrate the general range of tasks assigned to the Pesticide Applicator position, but are not intended to define the limits of required duties. Other duties may be assigned consistent with the general scope of the position.

The Pesticide Applicator reports directly to the Weed Board Coordinator. Duties and responsibilities of the Pesticide Applicator are to:

1. Be familiarized with spraying equipment and procedures and possess a Public Operator license.
2. Identify noxious weeds and undesirable vegetation.
3. Plan pesticide applications to be site specific for maximum results.
4. Mix and apply pesticides in accordance with work orders and applicable laws.
5. Review chemical labels and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for each product in use before application.
6. Use personal protective equipment as recommended by chemical labels.
7. Record spray applications on Washington State Department of Agriculture Pesticide Application Record as jobs are completed.
8. Apply pesticides using 1-ton truck with computerized spray system and equipment.
9. Apply pesticides using ATV with attached spray tank.
10. Calibrate and be responsible for the calibration of all spray equipment.
11. Maintain all application equipment.
12. Perform daily vehicle inspections.
