Geographic: The Yarborough Foundation predominantly makes grants to nonprofits in the Permian Basin and Trans Pecos regions of Texas.

Deadlines: The *invitation only* Grant Applications are mailed out in June and the Grants are normally approved by early August.

Grant Types: General Operating, Project/Program Support, Capital Improvement

Primary Areas: The majority of our grants are for General Support. The Yarborough Foundation attempts to keep the grants in line with the interests of the founder W. B. “Dub” Yarborough and only consider grants to 509(a)(1) and 509(a)(2) organizations with a proper IRS Determination Letter and other legal documents.

How to Apply: Grant Applications are *invitation only* and are thus not available to be downloaded or obtained randomly. When the Foundation has an interest, it contacts the nonprofit. However, a nonprofit may send a brief letter of introduction explaining mission and needs. This letter would be placed in a file that is reviewed annually. If there is an interest during a grant cycle, then Foundation would contact the nonprofit.

Restrictions: The Yarborough Foundation does not fund faith-based religious organizations (churches); give grants to individuals; pay tuition; give personal scholarships; do sponsorships; give funds to school booster clubs, fraternities, sororities or to organizations like the Rotary and Lions Clubs; do endowments or give to other private Foundations; give to emergency disaster funds; do emergency loans or grants or contracts for services. Since we have one grant cycle we rarely are able to help with Challenge or Matching grants.

Funding Type	Definition
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Capital Improvement	Funding for long term needs usually associated with facility; includes construction, acquisition, improvements.
<input type="checkbox"/> Challenge	Conditional grant that requires recipient to raise additional funds on a matching or formula basis usually within a specified period of time; used to help develop a diversified funding base.
<input type="checkbox"/> Contracts for Services	Often used by government. NPO agrees to perform services for the agency and is reimbursed after services are performed.
<input type="checkbox"/> Emergency Loans/Grants	A one-time grant or loan to help NPO meet short-term funding crisis.
<input type="checkbox"/> Endowment	A gift that is intended for investment purposes, where the principal becomes an asset of the NPO and the interest a source of income. Donors may place restrictions such as principal must remain intact in perpetuity.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> General Operating	Also referred to as unrestricted grants; used to cover daily expenses or administrative costs.
<input type="checkbox"/> In-Kind Gifts	A donation of goods and services as opposed to cash.
<input type="checkbox"/> Matching	Grant with the requirement that the amount be matched dollar-for-dollar.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Project/Program Support	A grant to support a specific project or program; money is restricted for this purpose
<input type="checkbox"/> Research	Grant to support the costs of studies, surveys, or clinical trials, including demonstration and pilot programs. Grants awarded to individuals are usually called fellowships.
<input type="checkbox"/> Scholarships	A grant award to an individual, usually for education.
<input type="checkbox"/> Sponsorships	A grant or donation that provides a marketing opportunity for the donor.
<input type="checkbox"/> Technical Assistance	Grants that support operational or management assistance such as fundraising assistance, budgeting and financial planning, legal advice, technical advice.
