aget Center is a Veteran housing program that provides emergency housing to 12 homeless Veterans for up to 60 days. Our goal is to "leave no man behind" by linking Veterans to services and benefits that help them find employment and permanent housing.



Our program is administered by Veterans for Veterans. Many of our staff have made the difficult transition from military to civilian life. The mission of our program is to help end homelessness among Veterans.

Like most aid-stations placed strategically behind combat zones, Paget Center stands poised to receive Veterans who are in need of support and treatment.

Paget Center offers comprehensive services that help alleviate homelessness among Veterans. The program is designed to help Veterans develop important life skills as they ready themselves to live more independently.

PAGET CENTER OFFERS:

- Semi-private rooms
- On-site staffing twenty four hours per day, seven days per week
- Welcoming common areas including a relaxing garden
- Laundry facilities
- A computer room
- Opportunities for skill development including meal planning and preparation
- Case management services that link Veterans to benefits and other housing options
- On-site support groups including; job interviewing skills, social skills training, PTSD and Seeking Safety

Our Case Managers coordinate services with the Department of Veterans Affairs and other community resources to enhance opportunities for success.

PAGET CENTER FEATURES:

- A comfortable residence that is centrally located and close to public transportation services
- On and off-site substance abuse resources
- Resources for the acquisition of skills and knowledge necessary to obtain suitable employment
- Life skills training that builds independence and self-sufficiency
- Mental health support to process issues that may impede progress and development.
