This ceremonial paying of respect is the final demonstration a grateful nation can provide to the veteran's family. The website will also serve as a resource tool for our nation's funeral directors as they assist veterans' families by arranging Military Funeral Honors.

By law, military units are required to provide, at a minimum, a two-person uniformed detail to present the core elements of the Funeral Honors ceremony. The core elements of the funeral honors ceremony, which will be conducted are:

- Playing of Taps
- [Flag folding](#)
- Flag presentation

The veteran's parent Service representative will present the flag.”
