Doctoral students and early career researchers are warmly invited to attend and present their research at the 2019 FINT Doctoral Colloquium. The colloquium will be held on January 9th, 2018, the day before the FINT conference main program, and will focus on supporting students in developing their careers and conducting high-quality trust research.

We are excited that Professor Audrey Korsgaard (University of South Carolina), an esteemed trust scholar, has agreed to give the opening keynote address. After this, the schedule will include interactive panel sessions that will be informative on issues relevant to doctoral students and early career scholars, such as 1) key factors for early career success, 2) managing scholarly and family life, and 3) an “ask the editors” panel featuring editors of journals where trust research might be published (e.g., Journal of Trust Research, Human Relations, and Academy of Management Annals). Participants will also have the opportunity to present and receive detailed feedback on their research from established trust scholars.

We look forward to welcoming you to the 2019 FINT colloquium. This colloquium will be a wonderful opportunity to network with other junior scholars as well as established trust researchers and reflect on your forthcoming academic career in a supportive and developmental environment.

Doctoral students and early career trust scholars are strongly encouraged to submit a research paper to the colloquium. **The NEW Deadline for submissions is June 15th via the conference website www.fint-2019.ch.** Papers will be reviewed by leading trust scholars prior to presentation at the conference, and participants will have the opportunity to incorporate this feedback prior to presenting. Papers in this category can be up to a maximum of 3000 words (including title, abstract, figures/tables etc.) PLUS references.
