

MINUTES

CITY OF LOGANVILLE Regular Council Meeting Thursday, August 13, 2020 6:30pm Council Chambers

The City of Loganville Mayor and Council met for their regularly scheduled Council Meeting on Thursday, August 13, 2020 at 6:30pm in the Council Chambers. Mayor Rey Martinez and Council Members Linda Dodd, Bill DuVall, Danny Ford and Anne Huntsinger were all present. Council Member Lisa Newberry joined via Zoom. Council Member Jay Boland was unable to attend.

Mayor Rey Martinez called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

WQC Supt. Chris Yancey gave the invocation and the pledge to the flag was lead.

Council Member Anne Huntsinger made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Council Member Danny Ford seconded the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

(Council Member Lisa Newberry joined the meeting via Zoom.)

Council Member Danny Ford made a motion to approve the consent agenda as follows:

Council Member Linda Dodd seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

Melanie Long made a presentation to the Loganville Police Department. Mayor Rey Martinez also recognized Alexis McDowell for her donations to the Police Department.

Council Member Danny Ford made a motion to extend the moratorium on Multi-family Residential Districts for an additional 60 days in order to make the necessary changes to the ordinance through advertising and review by the Planning Commission. Council Member Linda Dodd seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

The Mayor and Council discussed the procedure for appointments to the Planning Commission. After much discussion, the Council decided to leave the process as it is currently where interested individuals will complete an application and then will be interviewed by the Planning & Development Committee to make a recommendation to the full Council.

Council Member Anne Huntsinger made a motion to approve the purchase of property for the new Claude Brewer Water Pump Station (2019 Water Bond) for \$11,035.00. Council Member Linda Dodd seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

The Mayor and Council discussed whether or not to have the Autumn Heritage Festival this year in light of COVID-19. After discussion, Council Member Anne Huntsinger made the motion to move forward with plans for the festival and reassess the situation as we get closer to the date if necessary. Council Member Linda Dodd seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

Council Member Bill DuVall made a motion to proceed with plans for the Rock Road/Lee Byrd Road Realignment Project and allow for the engineering study to be completed. Council Member Linda Dodd seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.


