1.	Men involved in leading men to Christ. Men coming to Christ.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Equip men to share the gospel</li> <li>• Enlist speakers who bring an evangelistic message</li> </ul>	
2.	Men involved in healthy small groups or in one-on-one discipling.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conduct relationship building activities</li> <li>• Establish affinity</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue quarterly men's breakfasts</li> <li>• Take at least 15 men to District Retreat</li> <li>• Conduct at least three recreational activities</li> </ul>
3.	Men burdened for missions as evidenced by prayer for mission, giving to the Great Commission Fund, answering the call to the mission field and short-term mission trips.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Encourage participation in First Wednesday</li> <li>• Encourage attendance at mission conferences</li> <li>• Announce opportunities: short-term mission trips, approved special projects, etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Encourage giving to an approved special project</li> </ul>
4.	Men moving into ministry/leadership	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Disciplemaking: small groups, one-on-one, mentoring</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Establish a small group for discipling the leadership team</li> </ul>
5.	Men who understand biblical masculinity.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Study biblical masculinity: small groups, e.g., John Eldredge, etc.</li> <li>• Study biblical masculinity in large groups, e.g., Fraternity of Men – Robert Lewis.</li> </ul>	
6.	Men serving the church, community, district and the C&MA (ACT).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify project leaders</li> <li>• Plan, organize, equip projects</li> <li>• Identify district connections</li> <li>• Create skills matrix</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hold at least two workdays</li> <li>• Maintain a list of repair/improvement projects around the church</li> <li>• Consider participating in a Habitat for Humanity project</li> <li>• Consider sending a group of men to Waveland.</li> </ul>
7.	A church sensitive to the needs of men (Man Code) in worship, Sunday School, etc. A male friendly environment.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify what a man code is and what we want it to be</li> <li>• Build understanding among ministry leaders</li> <li>• Identify ways of making our ministries more friendly</li> <li>• Schedule a men's Sunday School class (occasional or continuing)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assess EAC's man code</li> </ul>

8.	Men in healthy fellowship – energized themselves and energizing the body.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conduct fellowship/relationship building activities</li> <li>• Hold or participate in competitive activities with other men’s groups or internally</li> </ul>	See 2 above
9.	Men in healthy marital and family relationships. Men discipling their families.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Schedule workshops/seminars on marriage, family</li> <li>• Conduct small groups with a focus on M&amp;F</li> <li>• General discipling through small groups or one-on-one</li> </ul>
