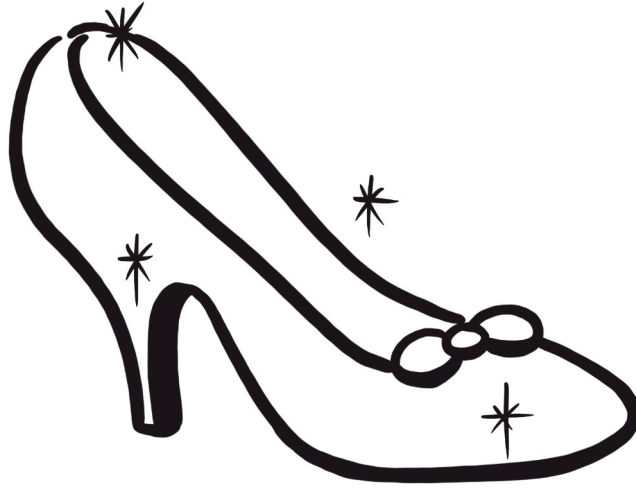

el cabello

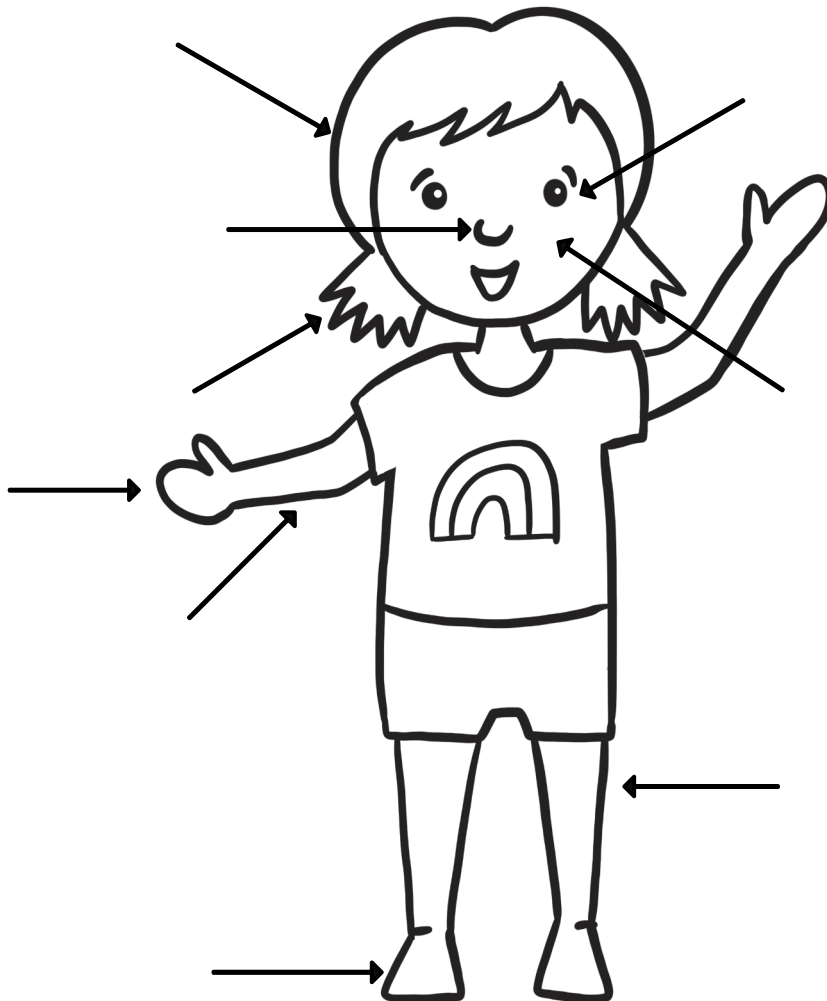
el brazo

EXTRA PRACTICE (In-class game):

1. Have students put this paper away, stand up, and close their eyes.
2. Read a word from the body part word bank on the previous page. Have students touch that body part.
3. Have students open their eyes and see if they are right.
4. If they are right, they stay standing. If they are wrong, they sit down.
5. Keep playing until there is a winner or you've said all the words **three times**.
