

Playgroups at SKCC

SKCC playgroups are where parents (the person who brings, stays and leaves with the child during playgroup) meet weekly during school terms at the community centre. Each session runs for approximately 2 hours either in the morning or afternoon.

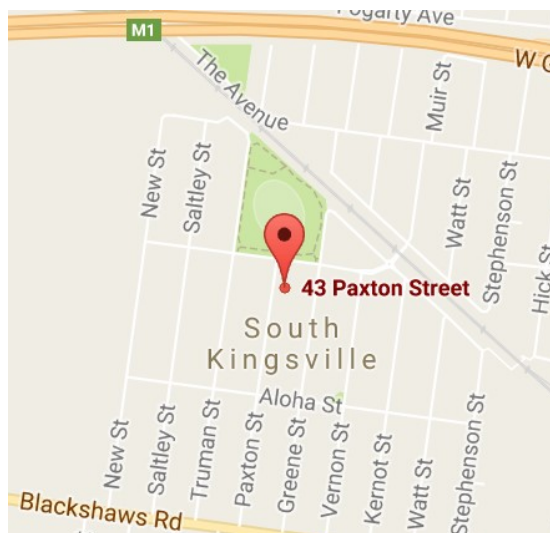
Playgroups will run subject to meeting minimum family enrolments, each group having a participating 'Group Leader'. SKCC playgroups are open to all families, while new groups can be created for a specific focus eg: age group, children with special needs or music.



SKCC playgroups are registered with Playgroup Victoria (Community Playgroup) and each group will assume oversight and responsibility for their playgroup routine and activities.

Playgroup fees are paid per term in full prior to commencing.

South Kingsville Community Centre playgroups are 'Parent led' and so the structure of each group and each session is decided by parents. Parents (mother, father, grandparent, carer etc) must stay with the stay during playgroup).

Typically a session may consist of one or more of the following:

- Indoor play
- Arts and crafts
- Story time
- Singing
- Music and movement
- Informal play
- Morning / Afternoon play



SKCC playgroups aim to provide a nurturing, safe and friendly environment where your child may learn and develop new skills, learn how to share through play, listen to stories and music, explore and socialize.
