Lice Lowdown

Nits under four days old have no nervous system so they cannot be killed by shampoo and must be manually removed.

Some lice are resistant to over the counter permethrin-based treatments.

Nits, or lice eggs, are yellowishwhite, oval shaped eggs that are glued to the hair shaft at an angle.

Nits must be laid by live lice.

Nits take 7-10 days to hatch, and another 7-10 days to lay their own eggs.

Lice are clear when hatched and then develop a reddish brown color after feeding.

A female louse can lay up to 100 eggs in a month.

Lice can only live off the human head for 24-48 hours.

No shampoo can get rid of lice with one teatment. Eggs under 4 days old can't be killed.

What do I do with bike helmets or headphones?

How Do I Prevent Reinfestation?

- Don't share brushes!
- Do not share beds, pillows, or hats.
- Girls should wear their hair in a braid, wrapped in a bun and sprayed with hairspray.
- To prevent reinfestation, launder linens, towels and hats.
- Vacuum rugs and sweep floors.
- Stow stuffed animals in a sealed bag for 2 weeks.
- Soak combs, brushes, clips and accessories in boiling water for 30 minutes, or put in a sealed bag for two weeks.
- Avoid sharing combs, brushes, and beds with infected people.
- Mayonnaise or Cetaphil may help the process of removal. Apply and sleep in a shower cap, then wash.
- Lice are contracted mainly through head to head contact.
