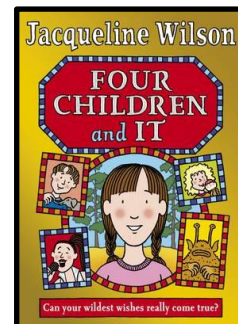


### **Bert the Bookworm Recommends...**

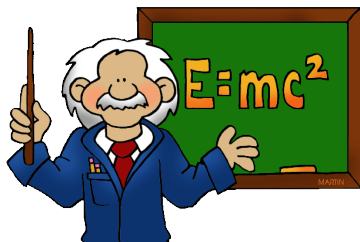
#### **Four Children and IT by Jacqueline Wilson**
