Bert the Bookworm Recommends...

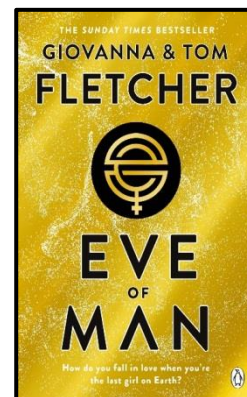
Eve of Man by Giovanna and Tom Fletcher

Book 1 in a trilogy.

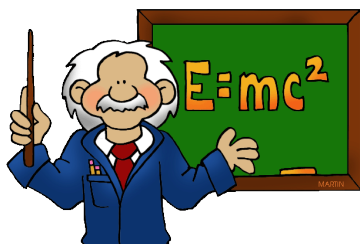
