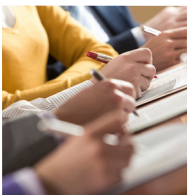

SUNNYSIDE VBS A HIT

July 25-29 was a big week at Sunnyside Adventist church! The entire church building (and many of its members) were transported half-way around the world and centuries back in time to the Land of the Pharaohs for Vacation Bible School (VBS).

Countless hours were spent in the planning and decorating for the annual VBS featuring the story of Joseph, "From Prison to Palace." Volunteers turned the sanctuary into a grand, golden-clad palace, reminiscent of Egypt's famous past. A lantern-lined tunnel passage led children back in time to the city streets of Memphis where they gathered in family groups, amid shops, markets and food stands to sing, study the Bible lessons, and learn about the story of Joseph.

The first night the children ventured into the damp, dark, musty "dungeon" to meet Joseph in chains. They eagerly listened to his story of capture, accusation and imprisonment. The second night at VBS they met the great Pharaoh himself who was very distraught over a recent dream he had. With wide eyes the children and adults listened to Joseph, God's faithful prisoner, interpret Pharaoh's dream. Everyone cheered when Joseph was released from prison and given oversight of the food and grain.

With their family-groups, eager children ventured through the markets to buy food and make crafts. Some crafts were for taking home and some, like the "Kids in Discipleship" teddy bear shop, gave

the kids opportunity to make something for those in Memphis (or Portland) who are less fortunate.

While some families were in the marketplace, others went out to the fields for games or down to the mud flats for brick-making. Gene Dennis, one of the head foremen at the brick-making center said, "Considering that we were making bricks all week, it actually wasn't too bad!" Asked if he'd consider helping again next year, he answered, "Absolutely!"

This rang true over and over as we walked the streets of ancient Egypt at Sunnyside. Lorene Beaulieu, one of the family leaders said, "The vitality and energy of the kids is just infectious. You can't help but have fun." One of the parents, Ginger Pape said, "The staff helping with this program far exceeded my expectations." Another visitor said that the sanctuary decor was the best he had ever seen at any church for any occasion.

Comments from the children were equally positive. Lauren Mann said that the shops were her favorite, especially the collar craft store. Ebba, Kelsey and Chloe each commented that the actual time in the palace with Joseph was by far and away their highlight of the week as the children learned that God gives hope, special abilities, wisdom, forgiveness and a family. Breanna Dalusong said that she looked forward to the games each night.

All-in-all it was a fabulous (and very full) week at Sunnyside. An unofficial survey taken at the door showed that 92% of the children were not ready for VBS to be over even after five days. Certainly everyone who participated in this year's Egypt adventure at Sunnyside was richly blessed!

JOHN LOOR ELECTED AS NPUC EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Loor, who has served as Montana Conference president since 2000, has accepted and will succeed Bryce Pascoe who retired on Aug. 1. Loor expects to assume these new responsibilities in October. Loor brings a variety of experience to his new role at the union office. Along with a Master of Divinity degree, he holds an additional degree in business administration with an emphasis in management. He and his wife, Susan, have two children: Cindy, who is married and lives in Loma Linda, Calif., and Rob, currently a student at Walla Walla University. Susan will fulfill her teaching role this school year at Mt. Ellis Adventist Elementary School before joining her husband full-time this next summer. "John is a spiritual leader of unquestioned loyalty to God's Word and the mission of our church," says Max Torkelsen, NPUC president. "He'll be a valuable addition to our leadership team."

PACIFIC PRESS REAPPOINTS MANAGEMENT TEAM

During its quinquennial constituency meeting held Aug. 12 in Nampa, Idaho, the Pacific Press Publishing Association board voted to reappoint the management team of Dale Galusha, president; Don Upson, vice president of finance; Chuck Bobst, vice president for production; Doug Church, vice president of marketing and sales; and Jerry D. Thomas, vice president for product development. They were affirmed for leading out in mission focus, improved product quality and increased efficiency and money-saving processes. Since the last session, more than one million Magabooks have been distributed, and literature evangelists have given more than 28,000 Bible studies.

JUST A FEW DAYS LEFT TO HELP MT. ELLIS AND UCA EARN \$1 MILLION

UNDERSTANDING THE NEARNESS OF JESUS' RETURN

One of the first organizations of the Seventh-day Adventist Church to be dedicated to the distribution of literature was the New England Tract Society in South Lancaster Massachusetts. Stephen Haskell established this society in 1871. For the next 10 years these societies spread throughout the conferences. In 1924 the name was changed to Book and Bible Houses and then in 1972 they became Adventist Book Centers.

Stephen Haskell was anxious that the growing church had a thorough understanding of the plan of salvation through the lessons taught in the earthly and heavenly sanctuary. In 1914 the Review and Herald published his book, *The Cross and Its Shadow*. A facsimile reproduction of this book is still available today.

Consider these statements by Ellen G. White, "The correct understanding of the ministration in the heavenly sanctuary is the foundation of our faith."--Letter 208, 1906. {Evangelism 221.2} "The subject of the sanctuary and the investigative judgment should be clearly understood by the people of God. All need a knowledge for themselves of the position and work of their great High Priest. Otherwise, it will be impossible for them to exercise the faith which is essential at this time, or to occupy the position which God designs them to fill." {Evangelism 221.3}

ADRA LEAVES SOMALIA

The Adventist Development and Relief Agency is one of three humanitarian agencies that Somalia's ruling militant group is asking to leave the region. Harakat al-Shabaab al-Mujahideen (Movement of Warrior Youth), declared in a statement last Monday that ADRA, World Vision and Diakonia can no longer operate inside the country because they are "acting as missionaries under the guise of humanitarian work."

As a global international humanitarian organization, ADRA is a signatory of the Code of Conduct for The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and NGOs in Disaster Relief, which states that "aid will not be used to further a particular political or religious standpoint", that "aid is given regardless of the race, creed, or nationality", and that organizations "shall respect culture and custom."

ADRA said it remains committed to serving the people of Somalia as circumstances allow.

OREGON CONFERENCE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE WRAP-UP

On Thursday, August 19 the Oregon Conference Executive Committee met for the bi-monthly meeting at the conference office.

Jon Corder shared with our executive committee the financial report for the month of June and, along with that report, a miracle. One of the financial indicators that we track is the cost-per-day to run the total conference. Back in 2008 we ended the year with an average cost of \$118,000 per day. Last year after all the reductions and cost cutting measures were calculated we ended the year at approximately \$113,000 per day. Though that was not as much as we had hoped for, it still was a blessing. However, to-date our average cost per day has dropped to \$103,000 per day! Again, this could still fluctuate but our prayer is that we will be able to end the year between \$103,000 to \$105,000 thousand per day. This along with the stability of tithe this year is giving us hope for a balanced outcome for the year. In case you are not “blessed” with a financial mind this is a very positive miracle. If you do thrive on spreadsheets and balance sheets, you know how great a blessing this is.

Another item of discussion that came out of the financial report was the non-tithe subsidy which is sent on to Walla Walla University (WWU). Our reason for the discussion was that though we had voted to cut the capital subsidy to WWU in half for one year, we recognized that this was an obligation that had been voted previously and that to arbitrarily cut without replacing at some time was not addressing our agreed upon commitment. After considerable discussion it was voted that we recognize our

obligation for these non-tithe funds and that as funds become available we meet this subsidy. A further motion asked the NPUC to evaluate all the subsidies given to the union to see that the percentage formulas were fair considering the challenging economic times we are experiencing.

Along with a couple of pastoral retirements and reassignments the executive committee also dealt with a recommendation to the North Pacific Union acknowledging that one of our pastors had voided their ordination by a moral fall. The committee also recommended to the union that we ordain Harold Altamirano. Harold has given exceptional service to the Oregon Conference for the past six years including his time at the Adventist Seminary. He has been instrumental in developing a multi-cultural church plant in the northwest portion of the greater Portland area which is to be organized as a company within the next few weeks. The ordination date has not been set yet but should be happening very soon. The final personnel decision was to appoint Doug Dietrich as the Trust Department Treasurer in place of John Rogers who will become the under-treasurer of the conference. Doug has spent the last number of years as the northwest regional head of auditing for the General Conference Auditing Services.

Once again, we thank you for praying for our conference and all the churches represented by this committee. Though there are challenging times ahead of us, we are reminded daily of God’s complete care and blessings in our personal lives and throughout our conference.
