



WE HAVE THE POWER TO STOP SB 10

A bad law that threatens justice and public safety.

SB 10 endangers public safety and costs millions.

SB 10 eliminates bail — a vital public safety tool that ensures people arrested for crimes will return to court for their trials. SB 10 will “increase crime and cost the public untold hundreds of millions of dollars,” warns Jeff Adachi, San Francisco Public Defender.

SB 10 discriminates against the poor and people of color.

SB 10 replaces California’s bail system with a computer-based “risk assessment” test that lacks transparency, and worsens racial and socio-economic disparities — discriminating against the poor and people of color.

SB 10 drew strong opposition from a wide range of groups.

SB 10 was widely opposed by crime victims, law enforcement, civil rights advocates and public safety leaders — including Crime Victims United, ACLU of California, Black Lives Matter, Sacramento Sheriff Scott Jones, San Francisco Public Defender Jeff Adachi, the California Bail Agents Association, Human Rights Watch, The Bail Project, and more.

Voters have the power to stop SB 10.

Despite warnings that SB 10 was dangerous and discriminatory, the governor and state legislators passed it into law. But thanks to California’s ballot measure process, voters have a constitutional right to referend SB 10 and stop it from being implemented.
