What is God Doing in the World?

Being in Jakarta recently for the World Evangelical Alliance General Assembly recently has given me a rather unique opportunity to answer to this question. 800 delegates from 92 nations gathered around the theme Intentional Holistic Intergenerational Discipleship Making. Which means: choosing to help younger people become more like Jesus in every part of their lives. There were two foci of the assembly.

The first was about the priority of making disciples. Whilst "Christian" appears only 3 times in the Bible "disciple" appears more than 250 times in the New Testament. Since Jesus commanded us to "make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:19) rather than to "make converts", Discipleship Making Movements (DMM) across the world insist we should disciple people so that they become converts, rather than discipling them after conversion. In Iran, possibly the fastest growing church on earth, the DMM teach that persecution causes converts to fall away but disciples simply get stronger in faith. Churches across the world which see the essence of discipleship as following Jesus in sacrificially serving the lost are planting groups which identify the biggest needs in their community then intentionally reach out to meet them. In some impoverished nations this has led to spectacular growth. The emphasis on evangelism over discipleship is a weakness of the Western Church.

The second focus was on discipling the young. E.g, Heart of God Church in Singapore has a membership of 4,500, plus many church plants, with an average age of 22. They reject an event-centred entertainment-driven approach by providing a home away from home for attendees. All the media of the church, worship teams, pastoral care etc. is handled by youth. Call and gifting are the criterion, not age. Sacrificial giving has become part of the fabric of their fabric. This approach is a huge challenge to our assumptions about when someone can serve Christ. We cannot ignore the sociological data showing that the generation (13-25) which is most connected electronically is the neediest of face to face relationships. The Lord has really challenged me about what this could mean for my life and ministry. As yet I don't have an answer.

Looking beyond what we see in Australia let's embrace by faith and support by prayer the reality that across the world today the Lord is doing mighty things. Amongst this he has a place for us.
