### Times and Seasons

In a general sense of the common grace given to all humanity, the Lord sends "fruitful seasons" for the joy of his creatures (Acts 14:17). More than this, in Christ, the ending of one season of grace means the opening of another, much as John speaks of "grace upon grace" (John 1:16). Dale and Joy have gone north to the vineyard of the Lord in Carnarvon, and we should pray for them a "hundredfold ministry" to the glory of Christ (Matt 13:23). They may in another season return to us as even wiser helpful parishioners.

Whilst I believe you understand this already, Donna and I are quite different from perhaps the majority of Anglican pastors. Although I was called by ordination in 1982, for the bulk of our Christian lives we have been a part of churches across a spectrum from Pentecostal to Lutheran. This diverse immersion helps us appreciate that the wisdom of God has "many colours" (Eph 3:10). Whilst being very committed to the ministry of Word and Sacraments, which are indispensable to the Anglican expression of Christianity, in many ways we do not see ourselves as exclusively Anglican. This partly explains why some of the folk who have joined St Marks through originally knowing us, come from non-Anglican situations.

I believe we are called to care, much like a father and mother, for the children of God whatever their background. Perhaps as Paul describes it (1 Cor 4:14-15). This does involve the difficult and wonderful matters of caring via instruction and godly direction (Heb 12:5-11).

We strongly need all your prayers. Donna asks for prayer for faithfulness to care and nurture. I am definitely going to need help, from people as well as God, when it comes to administration. Also, please intercede strenuously for the regular ministry of the Word.

Finally, please keep praying regularly for a younger minister to take over as full-time parish priest, someone who can commit a lengthy period of their life to lead in our midst.

# MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers



#### **Barnabas Fund**

Persecution of Christians around the world has increased in the last 12 months under the COVID pandemic, with followers of Jesus being refused aid (e.g. Vietnam), intensified government surveillance (e.g. China), and Islamic militants exploiting the crisis (e.g. Nigeria). One in eight believers globally face high levels of discrimination. There was a 60% increase in numbers of martyrs in 2020. Mostly in Africa.

Barnabas is bringing hope to suffering Christians by sending money, not people, through local churches and Christian organisations to fund projects being developed by locals. Recently, Barnabas paid for the liberation of 1261 Christian brick kiln families enslaved by debt in Pakistan. Their children can *now* attend Barnabas supported schools. Many other examples could be listed.

Please pray and assist Barnabas to be a voice to government and international agencies for our disempowered brothers and sisters throughout the world (1 Pet 4:10).
