The Tenses of Salvation

Put most simply, biblical "salvation" involves deliverance, rescue and healing from powers that destroy God's image and glory. This is something more powerful than we usually imagine, a simple story will illustrate.

A recently converted Salvation Army lass bubbling over with the joy of the Lord approached an older man in the street and asked, "Pardon me sir, but are you saved?" Unknown to her, he was Bishop B. F. Westcott, one of the greatest New Testament scholars. Smiling, and using some Greek, he replied, "Do you mean, I was saved, or I am saved, or I will be saved." When she was totally bewildered, he explained 'I know I have been saved; 'I believe I am being saved; and I hope by the grace of God that I shall be saved.' He went on to expound the three tenses of salvation, so much so that the lassie went on her way rejoicing at the riches of salvation: past, present, and future.

If you know Jesus, you have been set free from the guilt and penalty of sin. For example, "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, bwe1 have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (Rom 5:1). We are being set free from the power and bondage of sin, "neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, 10 nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God." (1 Cor 6:9-11). You will be set free from the presence and pollution of sin. For example, "our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, 21 who will transform four lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself." (Phil 3:20-21).

Through justification, sanctification and finally glorification the process of salvation will finally make you exactly like Jesus in sharing in his eternal relationship with the Father in the power of the Spirit. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." (2 Cor 5:17). Let's go our way rejoicing.
