Resurrection: Who or What?

Around this time of the year someone tells us that a resurrection is either unscientific or not biblical. Sadly, every church which denies the resurrection denies the power of the gospel and begins to die. Whilst I think there are powerful historical arguments confirming the raising of Jesus e.g. *The Resurrection of the Son of God*, N. T. Wright, I think we should put our focus elsewhere.

The most extensive passage on resurrection in the New Testament, revolves around a question, “How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?” Paul says this is a question put forward by a “fool” (1 Cor 15:35-36). Strong language, especially since Jesus warned, “whoever says, ‘You fool!’ will be liable to the hell of fire.” (Matt 5:22). Paul used such intense vocabulary because he realised that without the resurrection hell is the inevitable destiny of us (1 Cor 15:32). The wide belief in resurrection by Zoroastrians, Jews and Muslims points us away from speculation about a resurrection body to consider **who** it is we believe was first raised from the dead (1 Cor 15:20).

if Jesus is God-as-a-human-being, “conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary” (Apostle’s Creed), a resurrection for Jesus was unsurprising. Firstly, the destiny of an incarnate (“in the flesh”) God could be nothing less than to return to the realm of eternity. Exactly what Jesus expected (John 17:5). More importantly, nothing less than the glorification and making eternal of Christ’s human nature could follow his complete obedience to his Father. Why? In the Bible there is an infallible ordering in the ways of God, humiliation leads into exaltation. “(Jesus) humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9 *Therefore* God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name” (Phil 2:8-9). Lowliness leading into elevation is in fact a revelation of the essential nature of God we worship as Father, Son and Spirit. By faith Jesus saw the coming glory of resurrection through the lens of the cross (Luke 24:26; Heb 12:2). Scepticism about resurrection is however a failure to be humble like a child trusting that God’s justice will infallibly raise humanity to an unprecedented level of grandeur, resurrection life. I commend to you a reading of the song sung by Jesus’ mother (Luke 1:46-55).
