Abide in Me

The allegory of the Vine and the branches (John 15) has long been treasured as one of the deepest spiritual wells in scripture. “Abide” conveys a sense of deep rest vital to dwelling in what Jesus is saying. It reminds me of *The Practice of the Presence of God* by Brother Lawrence. He taught that at any time and place we can be aware that God is with us in a connection of mutual love. The towering medieval theologian Thomas Aquinas argued that if God could be reached by intelligence, or some other faculty that differs between people, some would have an unjust advantage over others. Abiding is an act of love open to all where we intentionally desire to be close to Jesus, always. Many will sincerely remark they can be conscious of the Lord’s presence as much in the garden as in a church building, but since “God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth” (John 4:24), we can be vitally aware of the Lord preparing dinner or in the toilet!

If we resist this sort of thinking as coarse or unspiritual it is because we have forgotten that Jesus “offered himself up through the eternal Spirit” (Heb 9:14). Though crucifixions were notoriously filthy with every sort of human excretion the most intense holy presence of the Lord was concentrated upon the humanity of Christ in his mess. Since this ordeal was *for us* there is nothing unclean in our past or present which has not been washed away by the blood of the cross (John 1:3; Heb 10:22). In God’s presence the follower of Jesus has no blame or shame as a barrier to “abiding”.

If we do have experiences of blame and shame, they will inevitably deceive us into *trying* to abide in the Vine. But we have already been placed in the Vine by our Father. Striving for the presence of God will lead to you acting as though you are a vine whose own effort will bring forth fruit. This is disastrous. Jesus will bring forth fruit through you as his life flows from his Spirit through your spirit into loving others. Spend time with him, repeat his sacred name (“Jesus”) often, tell him repeatedly, “I love you Lord”, sing him a love song. These are ways to flow in an abiding in the Vine.
