## An Incomprehensible God??

There's an old theological joke based on the ancient Athanasian Creed, "The Father incomprehensible, the Son incomprehensible, and the Holy Spirit incomprehensible." ... "The whole damn thing incomprehensible." Many have given up on trying to understand the Trinity; this is understandable, but also a spiritual mistake. Since the word "trinity" isn't in the Bible, but comes from the Latin *trinitas*, meaning "threefold", we shouldn't expect direct trinitarian teaching in scripture. Clearly, Peter didn't preach the Trinity at Pentecost. But on another level the Trinity was present that day in the most intense spiritual way.

"God" is mentioned in the apostle's sermon as acting in the life of Jesus eight times. This was the God of the Old Testament familiar to all Peter's Jewish hearers. When however, Peter says, "Jesus...Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing." (Acts 2:32-33) we enter a mixture of familiar and strangely unfamiliar territory. Always in the Old Testament the "Spirit of God" is a way of talking about God's personal presence and power. To say that the man Jesus could give the Spirit was a claim making him equivalent in authority with God (Joel 2:28 cf. Matt 28:18). How could this be?

The key to understanding this dynamic is the term "Father" to describe the relationship between Jesus and God. Whilst in the Old Testament God is in various places said to be the "Father" of Israel as a nation (e.g., Ex 4:22-23), the only individual he Fathers is the promised messianic son of David (2 Sam 7:14). This Son is identified in the New Testament as Jesus of Nazareth (Matt 3:17).

The ability of Jesus to receive Spirit of God from God the Father and to give him to those who are mere creatures identifies him as equal with both of them. God the Father gives the Spirit of God to God the Son to give to us! How remarkable, no wonder Jesus is worshipped (Acts 13:2) and prayed to (2 Cor 12:8). Since no-one can master an understanding of the Trinity in an intellectual sense, the important thing is whether we relate to Father, Son and Holy Spirit equally as God. If we do, we know God as Trinity and so we are surely saved.

## MISSION PROJECT UPDATE Information for your Prayers

### CMS – Church Missionary Society of Australia

Founded in 1799, the **Church Mission Society (CMS)**, formerly known as the **Church Missionary Society**, is a British mission society working with Christians around the world. Established in Australia as an independent agency in 1892, CMS has been setting apart long-term, cross-cultural workers to share the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ in gospel poor nations, equipping teachers and engaging Australian churches in cross-cultural mission. It has operated during WWI and II, the Great Depression, revolutions and civil unrest, droughts, tsunamis and the Spanish Flu', therefore equipping it well to continue to train and send missionaries in today's COVID world.

CMS International Director, Peter Rodgers reports:

- In Melbourne new missionaries have been trained and the St Andrew's Hall redevelopment completed on time and on budget despite the lockdown.
  - In gospel-poor Japan, church planters had to purchase a new building to cater for the many new members who had joined online.
  - The Argentinian Christian University Bible Group reached and disciplined more university online students than ever before.
  - In Timor-Leste, although COVID delayed the launch of the Tetun language translation of the Big Picture Story Bible, it was subsequently announced that it has become part of the National Curriculum for Protestant schools.
  - In the Spanish-speaking world, MOCLAM Bible courses have continued to bless and train church members.
- St Mark's Anglican Church, Bassendean has been supporting CMS for many years. State Director, Mr David Greeff, has visited us every year for the last three years and would be delighted to return to report to us in person.
