Beauty Betrayed: David and Bathsheba

This is one of the most infamous stories in the Bible, but it requires a depth of discernment (2 Sam 11-12). There is no suggestion David raped Bathsheba, she is simply a “very beautiful woman” (2 Sam 11:3). Whilst later 1 Chron 21:1), Satan incited David to sin, there is nothing in this story to suggest the devil “made him do it”. Pure lust and power is the explanation. But we should not overlook the special status of David as “a man after his (God's) own heart” (1 Sam 13:14) and “the anointed...sweet psalmist of Israel” (2 Sam 23:1). All of this makes David's sin worse.

It was David who waxed lyrical about his devotional purity, “One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple.” (Ps 27:4). How was David's desire to be in the glorious presence of God overwhelmed by a “very beautiful woman”. He must have known adultery meant the withdrawal of the Holy Spirit and the divine presence (Ps 51:11)? To look deeper than mortal weakness and sin we need to understand the counsels of God.

It was no accident that the king was at home on his rooftop, rather than on the battlefield, at the exact time Bathsheba was bathing (2 Sam 11:1-2). There is always a divine purpose in this temptation. The greater the test overcome in the strength of the Lord the greater the glory of God. As Jesus was perfected through his all his sufferings, from his 40 days in the wilderness up to the cross (Heb 2:10; 5:9), David also would have become so much more the image of coming King if he had resisted the lusts of his flesh (1 John 2:15). He neither turned to the commands of God nor his Holy Spirit for help. Therefore, the Lord visited him with the death of three sons, civil war, and devastating plague. Let us ask God to illuminate the all-surpassing beauty of Christ crucified which alone can deliver us from our temptations. “But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.” (Gal 6:14).

Excerpts from a book - NEVER TOO FAR - NEVER TOO FEW (100 YEARS OF BCA) By Robyn Powell.

A handful of people met together on 26th May 1919 to talk about how to get the good news of Jesus Christ into the outback. Revd. S. J. Kirkby became the first Organising Missioner of BCA in 1913. His first aim was to appoint a missioner to Wilcannia (NSW). The Revd. Fred Harvey was chosen ... and the Revd. Reg Hawkins moved into the Cobar parish. From none to two is a pretty good start!

S. J. Kirby set out to do exactly what he expected a missioner would do ... visit the tiny encampments at Cann River (Victoria), the fledgling towns, the lonely individuals in their tents. When he could get a small group together, he ran a church service and was encouraged by the number of people who came. It was not long before people began to see the possibilities in this wild area of the country and both male and female missioners set off to bring the gospel to the timber workers of Gippsland (Victoria).

Thanks to S.J. Kirby and enthusiastic missioners who have served in BCA throughout its 102 years of existence, it is still supporting ministries in remote communities across Australia.
