CHURCH ON THE RISE

Welcome to ST MARK'S BASSENDEAN

Fully Satisfied

Anglicans are familiar with this prayer: “All glory be to thee...our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and *satisfaction*, for the sins of the whole world”. In what sense was the Father “satisfied” with the death of Jesus?

It does *not* mean the Father was avenged by Christ’s death as though he had a blood lust that could only be met by Jesus’ suffering. This would separate Father and Son in a way untrue to the unity of the Trinity. The New Testament consistently teaches that the Father lovingly takes the initiative in sending Jesus to die for us. “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.” (John 3:16). “whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith” (Rom 3:25). Somehow, reconciliation produces a change in God before it produces a change in us. Jesus’ death can produce a change in an eternal, changeless God only if we allow the fact of the Incarnation to revolutionise all our thinking.

What it meant for the Son of God to become human is revolutionary. The saving of sinners is not accidental to God becoming human, but its very heart. “Incarnation is Atonement” (T.F. Torrance) means that the Person who dies on the cross is by his very being God come to save us, Immanuel. When Jesus dies, God as a human dies, and he dies in our place bearing the burden for our sin, separation from God, which we as mere creatures could never bear. Only God could bear what sin means to himself and he did it in the fulness of his own mercy as a decision made before creation and Fall (1 Pet 1:19 - 20). Jesus is the perfect union between a holy God and a broken humanity, so when we accept Christ are united by the Spirit to a Father who in Christ has received the holy obedience we would never give him; “for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified” (John 17:19). As such, our Father is fully satisfied with us *in his Son*.
