Inequality

The richest 1% own 43% of the world's wealth, a situation accelerated during the pandemic. In Australia, the highest 20% of the income scale live in a household with six times as much income as someone in the lowest 20% of the scale who hold just 1% of all wealth. We have adjusted to the sight of homeless people or beggars on the streets of our CBD, and now in front of my supermarket in Belmont. All this was absent when I first came to Perth in 1988. The Creator of all people never adjusts to the conditions which bring pain to those in his image. The prophets denounced insatiable lust for wealth, "Woe to those who join house to house, who add field to field" (Isa 5:8). Almost always in scripture, economic prosperity is associated with spiritual backsliding, "Israel soon became fat and unruly; the people grew heavy, plump, and stuffed! Then they abandoned the God who had made them" (Deut 32:15). The prophets rail against the sort of corruption that generates poverty on earth (Amos 5:11-24). Most significantly they envision a time when there will be no more injustice and so no more poverty (Isa 11:1-9; 29:20-21; Jer 22:16). In the New Testament, Jesus told a parable of the rich man condemned to hell for ignoring the poor man at his gate (Luke 16:19-31). After all, "Whoever mocks the poor insults his Maker" (Prov 17:5). James warns the unscrupulous rich that God will soon judge them because of their merciless treatment of their poor labourers (James 5:1-6). (This reminds me of the recent exposure of the fear-based working conditions at the Amazon warehouses in Australia where the labourers are too frightened to take toilet breaks.) What difference can we make to such vast wrongs. First, you can pray. Second, you can become connected to Christian groups that advocate on behalf of the poor and exploited. The Micah Network comes to mind (https://www.micahnetwork.org/). Third, you can watch your own levels of consumption. Look for products, like coffee, that do not use forced labour, and which are often available in supermarkets if you look (https://fairtradeanz.org/). Finally, live more like Jesus of whom it is said, "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich." (2 Cor 8:9).

MISSION PROJECT UPDATE

Information for your Prayers



CMS - Church Missionary Society has been working with Christians around the world since 1799.

Currently most CMS missionaries serve in pandemic-affected areas and have experienced neighbours, classmates or church members who have contracted or even died from COVID. Some missionaries even tested positive but recovered and been able to continue their work. During lockdowns missions moved online and for current missionaries, media and internet skills are important.

On Saturday 7 August **CMS WA** held an online prayer meeting at 9am where I was able to listen and learn about some of the missionaries.

Susan and Derk serve in Pakistan heavily affected by COVID. Movement is restricted.

David & Jenny Juniper are booked to fly to **Democratic Republic of Congo** later in August. Although the second largest country in central Africa, it is war-torn, and the people are poor.

Several missionaries are in **Italy**; **Gillian** in **Rome** and the **Fairclough family** bound for **Florence**. Both will read and study the Bible with university students and encourage them to follow Jesus. "The gospel can't be quarantined". During lockdowns they transfer to online often with an increased audience.

All the missionaries provide a "Kids Prayer Sheet" and also an "Activity Sheet". I have put a few activity sheets in our children's activity packs.

St Mark's Anglican Church, Bassendean has been supporting CMS for many years. State Director, Mr David Greeff, has visited us every year for the last three years and would be delighted to return to report to us in person.
