Being Human Today

The famous exclamation, “what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?” (Ps 8:4 cf. Psalm 144:3; Job 7:17; Heb 2:6–8), can be taken two ways. In the lower key, compared to the enormity and glory of the created world, it is strange that God makes so much of us humans. Alternately, that God does pay such interest in us is a sign that we are far above the rest of creation (Gen 1:31). In making so much of themselves amidst an expanding knowledge of the earth and the universe, recent generations have driven themselves into irrationality and depression. Things like race, gender and sexuality are far too small a lens through which to measure the meaning of life. The message, “It’s all about you.” “You’re the most important person in the world.”, combined with the scale of a COVID pandemic and issues like global warming are far too much for ordinary people to get their heads around. Of course, young people are depressed and deciding not to have children, and terrorised multitudes fear either infection or vaccination. The Bible’s answer for all humanity’s contradictory attempts to reach self-understanding narrows down the identity of the humanity of one person, Jesus Christ. Most importantly, the biblical answer as to who we are in Christ is a two poled one. On the one side is the distinguishing sign of Christianity, the cross, on the other is the symbol-less resurrection. You don’t need any faith to believe that Jesus was “crucified under Pontius Pilate”, in this sense the death of Jesus is just another fact of history. The evidence for resurrection life is altogether different. We believe in Jesus as sovereign Lord of all things in heaven and earth (Matt 28:18; Acts 10:36) primarily because we have detected the sort of changes in ourselves and others that can only be explained by our moving into the sphere of the unlimited glory of another world. This transition can be spoken about but cannot be measured scientifically nor proven philosophically. To the degree that we are “conformed to the image of his Son” to that degree we know “all things” (Rom 8:28-29) serve the one purpose of the Father to make us perfectly like Jesus. Knowing this integrates everything (Eph 1:9-10) and has power to heal the broken minds of our time.
