Watching and Waiting

It is plain, especially in Luke, that pious and devout Israelites were prayerfully waiting for the coming of the Lord. This had already long been prophesied (Gen 3:1; Isa 7:14; Mal 3-4), so their anticipation is unsurprising. The prophetic Spirit in Zechariah, Elizabeth, Mary, Anna, and Simeon indicates the Father was preparing his people for the first Advent of their Lord. They were not shocked by the birth of Messiah. Just as the Old Testament prophecies were not an exact timetable for the first coming, neither will Jesus' Return be predictable. "concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only." (Matt 24:36). Nevertheless, this hasn't stopped people, including folk I know, setting up timetables of when Jesus is returning. One writer famous argued that the Lord would return by 1988. (A generation after the establishment of the state of Israel). Just as at the turn of the millennium, with the Y2K bug scare, today there are folk telling us to stock up our pantries. (Some people folk sent me a "prophecy" to that effect recently.) However, it's important that we shouldn't ridicule these brothers and sisters and become like the scoffers mentioned by Peter. "They will say, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things are continuing as they were from the beginning of creation." (2 Pet 3:4). Unbelief in the nearness of Jesus' return is ungodliness for Christ himself says, "Surely I am coming soon." (Rev 22:20a). How then should we live? According to the New Testament we are to be "eagerly waiting for him" (Heb 9:28). Plus, whoever is looking for the Lord's blessed appearing "purifies themselves as he is pure" (1 John 3:2-3). We must suppose that the Bible ends with "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Rev 22:20b) because this is the highest priority of the Bride of Christ. Do we love the prospect of the Lord's appearing to judge the living and the dead (2) Tim 4:8), or are we more like the church in Ephesus who had "lost the love they had at first" (Rev 2:4)? These are serious questions of an ultimate nature, ones which I believe are best answered not by a mental response but by our prayers, especially that those who don't know Jesus as Saviour may swiftly turn to the Lord.
