The Catholic Church

(The Greek adjective *katholikos*, the origin of the term catholic, means 'universal' or 'whole'.) Whilst the language of “One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church” is grounded in the Nicene Creed, and the first, second and last of these terms are biblical, “Catholic” has become so corrupted as to be virtually unusable. We Protestants talk about *Roman* Catholics, but they will never use this term of themselves because they think it is sectarian. Within the Anglican Church we have High Church people termed Anglo-Catholic, or perhaps Liberal Catholic. Presently, I am reading a volume called “Reformed Catholicity”, a term indicating the authors think it is both valid and important to draw on sources from across the whole history of the Church. This is an approach I favour. In preaching I am just as likely to quote Augustine (4th century) as Luther or Calvin (16th century), relate to the writings of the great medieval scholar Thomas Aquinas (1225-74), appreciate the mystics of the pre-Reformation period, the depth of the Jesuit von Balthasar (1905-1988) on the beauty of the Lord and so on. Yet in the 18th century Puritan Jonathan Edwards I see extraordinary insight into the nature of God. My modern favourites include the very Protestant, Karl Barth (188-198) as well as a host of more contemporary writers like G. C. Bingham. In preparing an upcoming sermon series on Daniel, I am enthused by the writing of Scottish Presbyterian. Sinclair Ferguson. Is this smorgasbord a matter of random taste or has the Spirit of the Lord been guiding me? by now you should know that the answer to every theological question is _ _ _ _ . ‘The Bible is our compass, and Christ is our North, South, East and West.’ says the living Kevin Van Hoozer. The integrating point of all things is Jesus (Col 1:16), not the Jesus of popular fashion or cultural drift, but Jesus faithfully expounded to us through the Spirit in Scripture. Herein he is always spoken of, even if in Old Testament times hidden under types and figures (1 Pet 1:10-11). So, when we read a Christian author, past or present, we just know, in the Spirit of Jesus (1 John 2:20, 27) that they know/knew the same Lord as us. This recognition, appreciation, and assimilation of truth across the ages is the substance of what makes the people of God one, whole, “Catholic”.
