Immanuel, God with Us

I wonder what you might be worrying about at the moment? Whether there are things, even if you seldom admit it to others, you fear? And in the midst of those, do you ever wonder, is God really with me, or with us? Is God really willing and able to save?

If you know those fears, those are the exact kinds of questions which the people of Judah were wondering when Isaiah addressed his words to them in Isaiah 7. They were facing a fearful crisis: two other nations had teamed up and were seeking to destroy them. And Isaiah confronts the King, Ahaz, with a choice. To follow his own plans. Or to trust God to save. Sadly, Ahaz chose not to trust God. And disaster ensued for Ahaz and the nation.

But God wanted to show that he could be trusted to save. He gave a famous promise:

"Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14). Immanuel means 'God With Us'. And this child was to be a sign that God was with his people, and He could and should be trusted to save.

Then in the birth of Jesus, we read that this promise was most fully and finally fulfilled (Matthew 1:20-23). Jesus, 'conceived of the Holy Spirit', truly is *God* with us. And as the angel tells Joseph, he came to save – not merely from worldly powers, but the very power of sin and death itself. This has many wonderful implications for us and our lives. But the key one from Isaiah, is to know that we do have good reason to keep trusting God.

Even the so-called 'festive season' cannot mask the fact that we do not live in a Disney fairy tale. When faced with the very real fears in life, how will we respond? Will we turn to our own devices? Or will we look back to that baby born in a manger, to see there a sign that we can keep trusting God to bring about his promises to save his people?

O come, O Branch of Jesse's stem / unto your own and rescue them! / From depths of hell your people save / and give them victory o'er the grave. / Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to you, O Israel.
