Step by Step Guide to Plan Your Trip

- Share with friends at churches, schools and affiliate groups about joining your team.
- With dates in mind, contact missions@heartsinaction.org to check for availability.
- **Complete** the Trip Confirmation form HIA will email.
- Send a non-refundable \$500.00 check to the address below to reserve your dates.
- Your deposit will be deducted from the final payment.

- Look for airfare flying to Guatemala City (GUA) connecting to Flores, Petén (FRS)
- Schedule group meetings to pray, discuss goals, trace action steps, get passports, and fundraise.
- Discuss projects, your group's skills and abilities with HIA, and practice ministry presentations.
- Appoint a spiritual leader, coordinate team devotionals, before, during and after the trip
- **Encourage** the team to learn as much Spanish as possible. The Duolingo app is very helpful.
- Pray and stay involved with HIA both before and after your trip; you may share projects, volunteer or host a fundraiser.

Food, lodging, internet, administratives cost, ministry site planning and local ground transportation.

Packing Recommendations

- T-shirts & casual shirts
- Comfortable walking shoes
- Jeans & Light weight pants
- Women's long shorts, leggings
- Lightweight dress or skirts
- Personal hygiene products
- Poncho and or umbrella
- Hats, small backpack for day-trips
- Insect repellent & sunblock
- Sunglasses, water bottle
- Bathing suit, cover up & flip flops
- Bible, Notepad & Pen
- Light jacket, rain boots (optional)

Pack only what you are willing to carry.

To avoid any lost or stolen valuables
(i.e., jewelry), please leave them at home.



Weather: Petén temperatures range from an extremely hot 90-100 degrees F° during the day to mild 60-80° at night. It's summer most of the year with cooler times in December, January and February. Rainy season from June to November.

Women: please wear <u>very modest</u> clothing. No- Halter tops, mini-skirts, very short-shorts or bikini tops.

Prescriptions: be sure to bring your personal RX & additional medications such as: Benadryl, Ibuprofen, soothing itch creams or gels

Construction teams: please bring work gloves, boots and tools. The tools you use at home are even more necessary & valuable on the field! You may also bring tools to donate to **The Jungle School vocational program**.

Donations Are Welcomed

To bless HIA, TJS and nearby villages; here is a list of possible items to bring.

School Supplies - notebooks, notepads, pencils, pens, highlighters, coloring books & crayons
Art Room Supplies - dry paint, paint brushes, kids aprons, crafts items, glue sticks, playdough
Sewing Notions - needles, threads, buttons, tassels, rhinestones, fabrics, rick rack etc.
Classroom & Teacher Supplies - stickers, folders, markers, notepads, science equipment
Dance Team -black leggings for teen girls (12), shirts, masks, wigs and drama items, face paints
Music & Sound - instruments, bluetooth speakers, microphone, megaphone, any sound
systems or music
Office Supplies - labels, envelopes, staplers, sticky notes, rubber bands, permanent markers
(wide black)
Outreach Supplies - candy, prizes and little toys like frisbees, cards, small balls, yo-yo's,
balloons, etc.
Education - books & bibles in Spanish, board games, educational DVDS/CDs & movies
Clothing - kids clothing, shoes and sandals. Please do not bring extra large shoes and heavy
winter clothes.
Home - full & twin bed white sheets, kitchen towels, sandwich sized ziplock bags, solar lights,
Christmas lights
Hygiene - soap, shampoo, lotions vitamins, adult & children toothbrushes, deodorant,
perfumes, makeup, hair accessories
Construction - 25 foot tape measures (better if they have feet & metric), duct tape, blue tape,
garden snipers, extension cords (all sizes), paint brushes, sanders & sandpaper, electric hand
sanders and replaceable, batteries, dust masks



Health Considerations

Please inform HIA in advance if anyone requires an EPIPEN for allergies to bee stings. Notify us if you have any special health or medical conditions on your team. **Team** infirmities, physical disabilities, allergies or weight problems must be reported to HIA. Cases will be assessed on an individual basis and permission to travel could be granted or denied.

Anyone with a medical prescription should bring a written copy of their **prescription**. There are well trained medical personnel and pharmacies in **Guatemala** to handle most situations. However, an emergency can be expensive.

Check your **health insurance** to see if your coverage extends outside the U.S. If not, we recommend purchasing International *Health Travel Insurance* coverage for the time you will be in Guatemala.

We recommend having an up to date **Tetanus Shot**; it lasts about 10 years. **Vaccinations** are not required to enter Guatemala. You do not need malaria medicine. **Hepatitis A, B, and C are optional.**

Nausea or diarrhea could be considered a normal part of the **experience in a new country.** They are usually caused by your stomach adjusting to foreign bacteria; please inform your HIA leader if anyone on your team have such discomfort.



Four Weeks Before Departure

- ☐ Full in-country payment must be sent to:

- ☐ Complete the **Team Information Form** and email to HIA.
- □ Have all team members complete the Medical and Insurance Release Form, email or bring with you to HIA.
- ☐ Email HIA your **flight itineraries** & excursion choices.
- Make **color copies** of each passports photo page, send with the team leader.
- ☐ Make a colorful **luggage** tag for the group's bags.
- Please inform HIA of any last-minute airline changes, late arrivals, special situations, dietary needs, medical conditions etc. Email: missions@heartsinaction.org



Departure Day

- Arrive at the **airport** three hours before departure time; this is standard for international travel and necessary with a large groups.
- Mark and count your **luggage**. Assign a person to be responsible for keeping a check on luggage, especially when arriving/leaving local airports & bus stations.
- **□ Documentation**: Make sure the following documents are in order:
 - □ Airplane ticket
 - ☐ Current passport. **Carry it,** do not pack it in your checked luggage
 - Minors (under eighteen years old) must carry a notarized permit signed by both, parents or guardian stating that he/she is permitted to travel to Guatemala.
- If traveling to **Guatemala through Belize by bus**, the team has to get off the bus and walk through Belize/Guatemala border, go through immigration, then get back on the bus. The exit fee for **Belize is \$20.00 USD** per person; there is no fee to exit Guatemala.
- ☐ Communication: we suggest forming a WhatsApp group chat PRIOR to arrival to communicate with your team as it works well in Peten, Guatemala. Note that internet does not work well when you travel to some villages within Guatemala.
