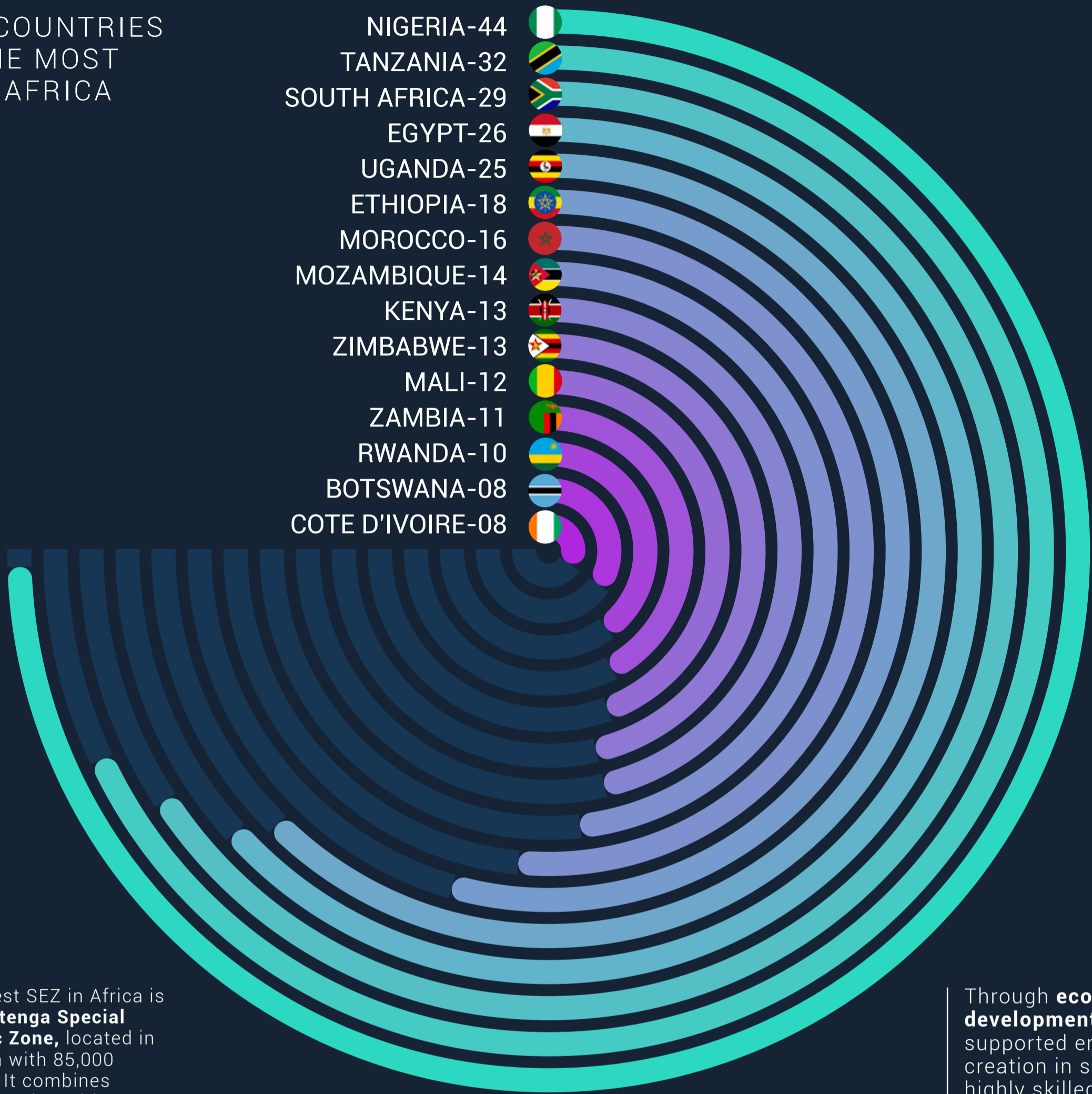

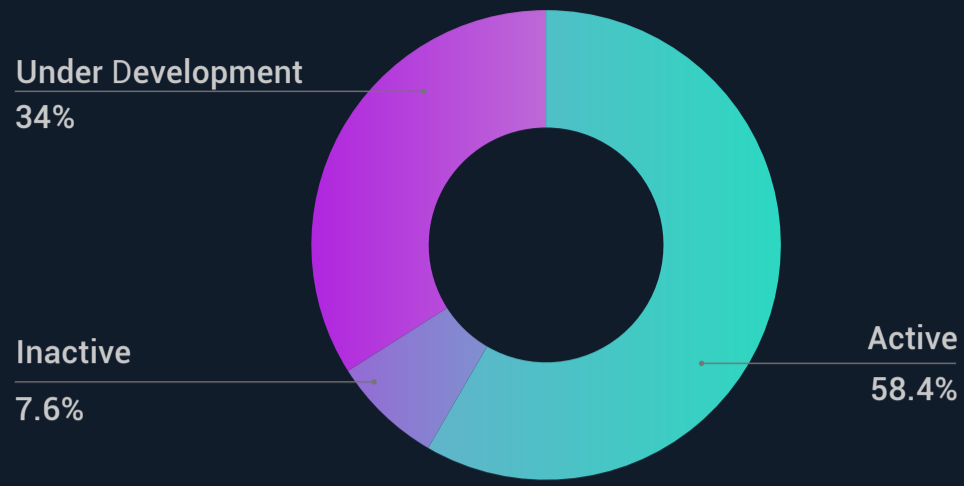
The biggest SEZ in Africa is **Pandamatenga Special Economic Zone**, located in Botswana with 85,000 hectares. It combines modern farming with top-notch industrial, residential, commercial, and recreational facilities.

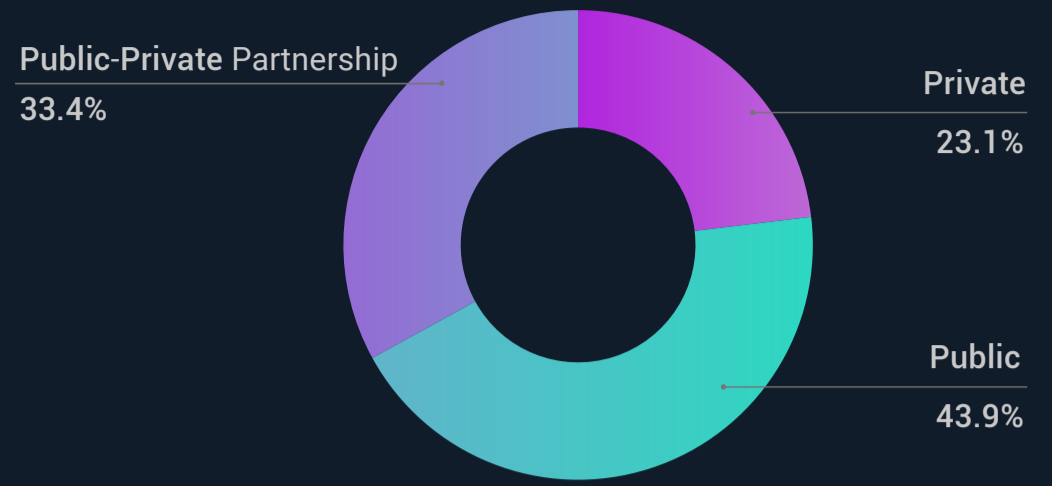
BREAKDOWN OF SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONES IN AFRICA BY ZONE TYPE

DEVELOPMENT

Konza, a special economic zone in **Kenya**, has set aside **1000 acres** for wildlife conservation.



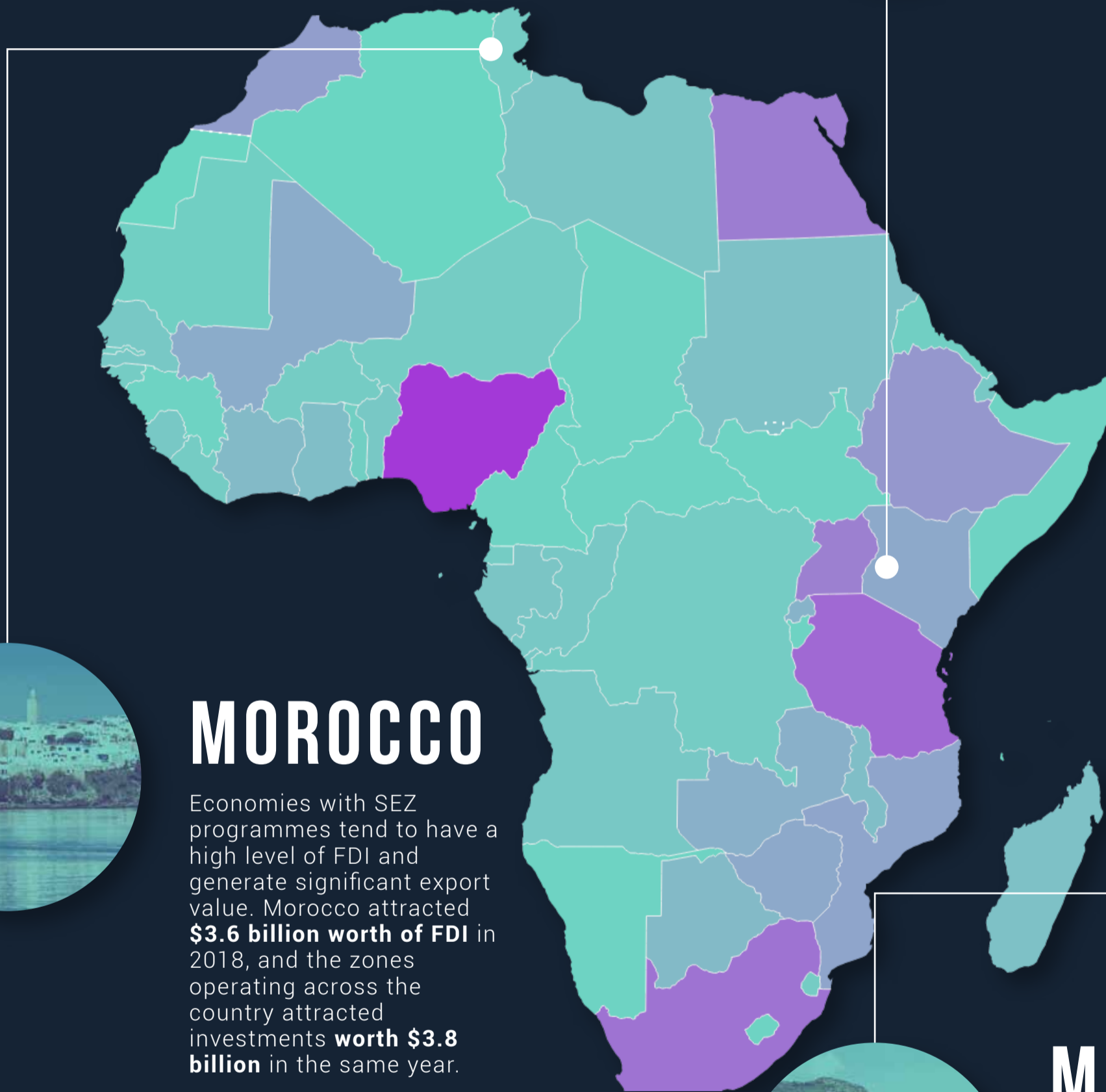
MOROCCO

Economies with SEZ programmes tend to have a high level of FDI and generate significant export value. Morocco attracted **\$3.6 billion worth of FDI** in 2018, and the zones operating across the country attracted investments worth **\$3.8 billion** in the same year.



MAURITIUS

SEZs were first implemented in Africa in 1970 when Mauritius enacted its **Free Zones Act**. Other countries, including Ghana and Senegal, began developing SEZs in the late 1970s.
