The Suwalki Corridor, a 65-kilometer-wide strip of territory linking Poland with Lithuania, is considered NATO's most vulnerable choke point along its eastern flank. In the event of a conflict, a foreign army could attempt to close the corridor and incapacitate NATO as a security provider for its three Baltic members. Using this particular situation as a metaphor, Robin Hinsch captured Europe's most potential conflict zone. Cutting back and forth between different locations, "SAPAD" an atmospheric essay, a cinematic sequence of photographic artefacts, hints and thoughts about the future of the European Union.
