POLICY FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICINES TO CHILDREN — this policy has recently been updated (effective immediately) and is as follows:

We have sought advice from the school nursing service and the following procedures are now in place at Lightcliffe CE Primary School.

1. 'Over the counter' medicines such as Calpol, Buttercup Syrup, Piriton etc. will not be administered in school.
2. If prescribed medication has to be given 3 times a day, it should be arranged so that it is not necessary for it to be brought into school.
3. We understand that if prescribed medication has to be taken more frequently (ie. 4 times daily) it must be brought into school.

In the event of a medicine being prescribed by your child's doctor to be taken 4 times a day you, as a parent, have the choice of either:

- a) coming into school with the medicine and administering it yourself to your child, or
- b) completing the pink 'Medicine in School' form from the school office and informing the class teacher via a written note.

If you choose option b) then it is on the strict understanding that the school can accept no liability for failure to administer the medicine.

NO medicines will be administered without the pink form having been completed by the parent/guardian.

We will not administer ear, nose or eye drops or throat sprays to the child and therefore option a) will be necessary.

In the interest of health and safety ALL medicines should be taken straight to the school office by an adult and must NOT be left with your child (or with the teacher in the classroom).

4. For the control of asthma (which still needs recording on a pink medical form) the inhaler must be clearly labelled (both canister and case) with the child's name and class and taken to the school office. It will then be given to the class teacher who will ensure that it is available at all times during the school day.

If your child has an Individual Healthcare plan, special arrangements will be put into place.

Please note, exceptional circumstances will be considered by the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher on a case by case basis.
