Title: Speech and Language Pathologist

Primary Functions: Under the supervision of the Director of Communication Services, participates as a member of multi-disciplinary team in assessment; IEP/IPP planning and providing services to student/consumers with special needs.

1. To provide diagnostic and therapeutic services and identify communication disorders and implement speech and language services following approved procedures.
2. To observe and monitor student/consumer behaviors and development in their environment and present activities that are developmentally appropriate for the student/consumer designed to conform to the student/consumer's IEP/IPP.
3. To interact and consult with family members, teachers and other service providers, as needed.
4. To assist parents to seek and coordinate other services in their community that may be provided to the student/consumer by various agencies.
5. To assist in providing opportunities for student/consumer's to develop self-esteem and academic skills.
6. To assist in providing access to various developmentally appropriate equipment and specialized materials.
7. To monitor and coordinate assessment and reassessment procedures, IEP/IPP meetings and student/consumer activity progress.
8. To carry out additional activities as requested by the Director of Communication Services.

Education/Experience: Must hold a California State License to practice Speech and Language; and have experience with individuals with Communication Disorders. Meets REACH's Risk Management Standards for transporting student/consumers.

Specific Skills: A thorough knowledge of the most current issues strategies and diagnostics surrounding communication training for adults/children with disabilities; a thorough understanding of the concepts surrounding facilitated communication specifically and augmentative communication strategies generally; an understanding of the Developmental Disabilities System in the State of California including all applicable State/Federal regulations and Special Education; excellent written and communication skills; the ability to move around the community using some form of transit and the ability to transport others; ability to efficiently communicate to staff, families and the community at large.

Must be at least 21 years of age, successfully complete health and fingerprint screenings, show evidence of current first aide/CPR training and complete a Criminal Record Statement prior to employment.
