TRAVEL TIPS TO ORLANDO

What to bring! Get your pen out and tick these boxes

If you are unsure about any of the items you should bring, or any other info in this guide then you should talk to your teacher - better to be over-prepared than under-prepared!

WHAT TO PACK

CHECK



DAY TO DAY CLOTHING

T-shirts and tops, jeans, pants or skirts, plenty of underwear and socks & nightwear.



SUN PROTECTION

Sunscreen, a sunhat, sunglasses & lip protection.



PERSONAL TOILETRIES

You will need a toothbrush, toothpaste and any required medication.



WARM / WATERPROOF CLOTHING

Bring warm clothes for the evenings and a waterproof in case of bad weather.



FOOTWEAR

Comfortable closed-toe shoes are essential. The Kennedy Space Center and the theme parks involve a lot of walking. Don't forget to bring an extra pair with you in case these get wet.



OTHER

Bring a towel and bathing suit for the pool or beach if within school regulations. You will need a water bottle with you and a small backpack that will fit in a theme park locker. Also, don't forget your camera or video camera and your chargers.

THE ESSENTIAL STUFF

PASSPORT, VISA & MONEY



HELPFUL TIP:

Do not bring any agricultural products or fresh food with you when coming through Customs, they are strict on this rule!

SPENDING MONEY

Bring enough money to cover lunches, drinks and snacks (approx \$20 USD per day) You might also want extra for souvenirs and shopping! We recommend having your money in at least two different forms - e.g. cash and card, credit and debit card. Just in case one fails or is lost.

01 DON'T LITTER!

Help out by putting your rubbish in the right place. This includes when traveling on buses!

02 ACT RESPONSIBLY

There will be times when you get frustrated with others, but be positive and become a leader

03 TAKE ONLY PHOTOS

and leave only footprints - show respect for the local environment.

04 BE SENSITIVE

Be sensitive to cultural practices - you are not expected to know all that is required. Your tour manager will advise when required.

05 LISTEN

Listen to instructions - these will come from your teachers and your tour manager.

06 RESPECT OTHERS

Support and respect your fellow classmates - keep the mood positive and everyone will benefit - especially you!

07 REPRESENT

Represent your school well - leave a good impression everywhere you go.

08 LOOK AFTER YOURSELF

Make sure you help yourself to recover from jetlag by getting a good nights sleep and drinking water.
