## Reflections from the Outgoing Chair, Ron Dorn

In the year 2000, I was captured by the wonderful story of Gilbert's Potoroo, an animal thought to be extinct for nearly 120 years, now rediscovered at Two Peoples Bay in 1994 and numbering only approximately 35 individuals. This prompted me to join in the call for an "action group" to help this critically endangered, unique marsupial to recovery.

By 2001, I was Chair of the Gilbert's Potoroo Action Group [GPAG] – a group of passionate community members with a mission to support the then Department of Conservation and Land Management [CALM] in plans for its recovery.

Over the next 18 or so years, as Chair, I worked with a dedicated group of volunteers to raise funds, undertake volunteer work and to raise awareness of the status of GP, at all times working with CALM [now Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, DBCA] on strategies to increase the population. Efforts at captive breeding, hand rearing, and cross fostering were not considered successful.

In 2005, the first translocation of GP to Bald Island took place. Then followed the establishment of the fenced reserve at Waychinicup. These habitats were feral predator free [ie no cats and foxes].

Had it not been for the first translocations to Bald Island and Waychinicup, the devastating fire at Two Peoples Bay in November 2015 would have made GP extinct.

In 2018, our success in securing a Federal Grant of \$250,000 enabled us to support DBCA in a trial translocation to Middle Island, east of Esperance, to create a new safe haven population for the Potoroos while the habitat at Two Peoples Bay recovers.

The reward for my years as Chair of GPAG has been the opportunity to work with great, dedicated volunteers and the DBCA scientists, especially Dr Tony Friend but, most of all, has been the result that despite still being critically endangered, GP survives in three "ark" populations totalling approximately 100 animals.

I will continue to help and support the Recovery Plan efforts, but it was time to hand over to others. Already, the new Chair, Ken Bushell has proposed innovations that will continue to make for progress and success. I look forward to joining the celebrations of the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of GP's rediscovery at the end of November and hope for the day when Gilbert's Potoroo can be re-established in its home environment on Mount Gardner at Two Peoples Bay.

## VOLUNTEERING

### Edith Cowan University Work Integrated Learning (WIL) Students

This is my first time to get a “job” in University and I am very pleased to have an opportunity to work with the Gilbert’s Potoroo Action Group as a volunteer to assist to improve the awareness of people to protect the Gilbert’s potoroo. Jackie Courtenay is my supervisor for this work and she has given me a lot of information about both the organization we are working in and the Potoroo. She is very knowledgeable and always giving lots of suggestions to me during the work. For me, I really want to make some efforts either for the environment or ecology. GPAG has given me the best chance to do this but is also a challenge for me. To work with social media is a great practice to improve my skills of using computers and increase my experience of working online. I will cherish this opportunity to work for GPAG and try my best to help people care more about the Potoroo!



Hi, my name is Dinuo Peng. I am an international student who comes from China. I previously studied at Beijing University of Agriculture and I am now finishing my last year of university at Edith Cowan University through a cooperative program between BUA and ECU. I am very excited that I can work as a volunteer for the Gilbert’s Potoroo Action Group this semester. My supervisor, Jackie Courtenay is a very patient lady and has offered me so much valuable advice. I am very appreciative of her help and I will contribute myself to GPAG for the rest of this semester. I wish I could have the opportunity to visit Two Peoples Bay someday. Two Peoples Bay is where Gilbert’s Potoroo was rediscovered. I want to see this rare marsupial and I would be thrilled if I could touch it, or even hold it. I love nature and it brings me the greatest pleasure to help animals and protect them from extinction.



Hi, my name is Zora and I am a fourth year undergraduate student completing my Bachelor of Science in Environmental Management at ECU. I come from China and, because of the school's cooperation project, I have this opportunity to study in Western Australia. While in my 2019 semester, I have an assignment to do a work placement, so I have chosen to do the communication activities in Gilbert's Potoroo Action Group (GPAG) as an Assistant Communication Officer with my supervisor, Jackie Courtenay. The main reason I chose GPAG is that the Potoroo is a very cute kind of marsupial and China does not have any of those kinds of mammals so this is a good chance for me to learn more relevant biology knowledge about marsupials. Also I want to help the Gilbert's Potoroo population to live and reproduce better in Australia, while I can also learn some new skills, such as operating social media or editing webpages, which can help me a lot in my future work.



### **Checking of Motion-sensing Cameras**

During September, volunteers were invited by DBCA to participate in the checking of motion sensing cameras at Two Peoples Bay. Two GPAG volunteers participated in the work changing the batteries and recovering the SD cards from the cameras. While no Potoroos were recorded on the cameras the images nevertheless revealed echidna, honey possum, quenda, quokka, bushrats, kangaroos and birds as well as (unfortunately) cats and a fox, which is all important information.



## Awareness Raising

### WA Threatened Species Forum


On September 5 and 6 our Deputy Chairperson, Leigh Whisson and Communications Officer, Jackie Courtenay attended the WA Threatened Species Forum in Geraldton organised by the Northern Agricultural Catchments Council. We were lucky to be allocated two 20 minutes speaking slots in the program with Jackie presenting a talk entitled “Community Engagement in Threatened Species Recovery: The challenging case of Gilbert’s Potoroo” and Leigh explaining why we needed to update our website and showing some examples of the new design. Both talks received a lot of positive feedback from other conference delegates.

Gilbert’s Potoroo was also well represented in other talks to the extent that some speakers started spontaneously slipping Potoroo references into their totally unrelated talks for fun and laughs from the audience. The final panel on Friday afternoon was rewarded with bottles of Potoroo labelled wine and the attendees made aware of our upcoming annual wine fundraiser. Gilbey made an appearance at the sundowner on the first evening along with other threatened species mascots from Perth Zoo. There was also the opportunity to meet with the Threatened Species Commissioner, Dr Sally Box, and discuss the upcoming launch of our new website and in particular the planned events to celebrate 25 years since the rediscovery of Gilbert’s Potoroo. Overall, it was a great conference and provided excellent opportunities for awareness raising, with an unexpected amount of free publicity for Gilbert’s Potoroo and GPAG thrown in! ### New Website

Due to some unavoidable circumstances, the launch of our new website at the WA Threatened Species Forum in Geraldton was unable to go ahead and the website will now be launched at a later date to be announced. As mentioned above our Deputy Chairperson, Leigh Whisson, gave a “sneak peek” of the website at the Forum and received some very positive feedback about the new design. ## **Threatened Species Bake Off**

The Threatened Species Bake Off was launched by the Threatened Species Commissioner in 2019 for the third year in a row ahead of Threatened Species Day on September 7. The Bake Off aims to build awareness in the community about Australia's threatened wildlife, by inviting Australians to bake a dessert that resembles a threatened species. The 2019 submissions were again judged based on the likeness to the chosen threatened species and the creativity of the design and a People's Choice award was given to the creation that received the most Facebook 'Likes'. Marnie Giroud again produced a fantastic cake for Gilbert's Potoroo. Even more innovative than last year, the cake included a mother and young Gilbert's Potoroo feeding on truffles while threatened by a fire and fox lurking in the background. While the cake did not win any of the awards, and we may be just a little bit biased, we think the cake was absolutely brilliant in its creativity in that it told a whole story about Gilbert's Potoroo – its unique diet and two of the main threats to its survival.

## GRANTS AND SUBMISSIONS

### Senate Inquiry Submission

The Senate Inquiry into Australia's faunal extinction crisis was re-adopted in the 46<sup>th</sup> Parliament for inquiry and report by November 13<sup>th</sup> 2019. On July 29<sup>th</sup>, the report date was extended to the last day of the 2020 Autumn sittings of the Senate. Public hearings were held in Sydney and Canberra on August 20<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> respectively. *The Gilbert's Potoroo is a critically endangered marsupial, thought to be extinct for over 100 years but rediscovered in 1994 at Two Peoples Bay, on the south coast of Western Australia. For many years, the only Gilbert's Potoroos known to exist in the wild were confined to this single population, comprising less than 40 individuals. Conservation action then included the establishment of a second population on Bald Island, which currently numbers about 70, and a fenced area on the mainland with about 20 potoroos. Fires in November 2015 decimated the original colony and habitat at Two Peoples Bay leaving minimal potoroos. It may be about 10 years before this area is able to sustain another colony. Since then a fourth colony of 10 has been established at Middle Island in the Recherche Archipelago.*

Four fabulous wines from the award winning Jingalla Winery have been specially labelled to feature the Gilbert's Potoroo. Profits from the sale of the wines will directly support the recovery of this species and the ongoing work of Gilbert's Potoroo Action Group Inc.
