CORRUGATED CARDBOARD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must be clean, dry and loose • Remove packing materials • Flattened and loose 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO waxed or plastic-coated boxes
GLOSSY MAGAZINES & CATALOGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any magazines and catalogs, staple or adhesive-bond + Must be clean and dry 	
NEWSPAPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clean, dry and loose • All newspaper inserts OK 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO plastic bags
OFFICE PAPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All white or colored printer, computer, copy, NCR and fax papers; envelopes, file folders and junk mail. • Clean and dry • Remove non-paper contaminants 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO carbon paper or blueprints • NO paper ream wrappers • NO paper cups, plates or tissues
TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All white or yellow page directories • Clean and dry 	
PAPER DROP-OFF INSTRUCTIONS:	NOTE With the exception of cardboard, all of the above paper materials, dropped off at a Franklin County SWMA recycling facility, can be combined in the same bin. If you use a recycling hauler or municipal service call for preparation instructions.	
COMMON HOUSEHOLD MATERIALS:		
CLEAR GLASS Clear food & beverage bottles ONLY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Empty and rinse out residue • Labels and neck rings OK • Don't break or crush 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO colored or tinted glass • NO ceramics, dishes or glassware • NO window glass, mirrors or light bulbs
PLASTIC BOTTLES & JUGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • #1 & #2 bottles and jugs only (look for a seam along the sides and bottom) • Remove and discard caps • Rinse out residue and flatten 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO #2 oil bottles or pesticide containers • NO tub-type containers, pails or buckets (even if they have a #2) • NO other types of plastic (#3 - #7)
TIN CANS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Food and beverage cans only • Empty, clean and flattened - labels OK • Steel ("Tin") only - attracted by magnet 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO aerosol cans or propane cylinders • NO pesticide or paint cans • NO scrap metal
SPECIAL HANDLING MATERIALS:		
YARD WASTE <i>Leaves, grass clippings & brush</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep brush separate from leaves and grass clippings • Start a home composting bin. Call CFSWMA for a free guide to home composting. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO plastic or paper bags • NO food waste • NO animal manures
SCRAP METALS & LARGE APPLIANCES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scrap metal \$50.00 per ton; weighed at each site. • Appliances \$5.00 each. Refrigerators and freezers - \$5.00 each if certified freon-free; otherwise there is a \$30.00 fee for freon-removal. 	
TIRES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passenger/light trucks 16" or less = \$3.00 each or 5.00 with rim • Truck tires 16" to 25" = \$5.00 each or \$10.00 with rim • Tractor/loader tires = \$50.00 each 	Note: All materials in this guide are accepted from both businesses and households.
