Grocery stores special shopping periods

The elderly and those with serious pre-existing conditions are at highest risk of developing severe symptoms from coronavirus, or COVID-19. In a bid to protect those customers, these stores have set up special shopping periods for at-risk populations:

- Target will reserve the first hour of shopping daily for senior citizens.
- Foodland will set aside the first hour of business at stores statewide on Tuesday, Thursday
- and Saturday to serve only those 60 and older and their caretakers. The program will start
- Thursday and continue through March 31.
- Times Supermarkets will reserve the first hour of its store opening every day for seniors and
- people with serious chronic medical conditions. The change will go into effect on Friday
- until further notice.
- Tamura's Market will open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 7:15 to 8 a.m. for seniors
- (age 60 and older) and an accompanying family member or caregiver. This will start Friday
- and continue through March 30.
- Whole Foods Market stores will open for seniors 60 and older one hour before opening.
