MENTORSHIP

Participating Alliance teams will be provided with the following mentorship resources:

- TxDOT federal grant group consultation
- 2-3 strategy meetings with a mentor to be scheduled at your convenience to assist with presentation preparation and grant narrative development
- Red team review of a near-final grant application by mentor

PRESENTATIONS

Each team will have **seven minutes** to present their final pitch for an innovation zone with five minutes for question and answer.

Key topics should include: challenge definition, vision, map of project location, project partners, technology solutions, performance metrics, and community benefit. Presenters are highly encouraged to tell a story, using slides with images that convey the human and technical aspects of the project.

CRITERIA

Selection criteria are as follows:

- Challenge Definition Is the community challenge clearly identified, articulated, and appropriately scoped (not too big, not too small)?
- Goal Alignment Does the proposed solution support TxDOT and USDOT goals?
- **Effective Collaboration** Are the necessary public agency, community, and industry partners actively engaged? Is there a community engagement strategy in place?
- Innovation, Data Management, and Technical Merit Is the solution innovative? Is there a data management strategy in place? Has the solution been adequately developed to identify the appropriate technical components and required expertise?
- Broader Impacts and Performance Measurement Does the proposed solution benefit the community? Is the solution scalable and replicable to other Texas communities? Is there a performance measurement plan in place?

AWARDS

Judges will select up to two winners on September 19, 2023 to receive the following:

- TxDOT federal grant red team review and formatting of a nearfinal grant application developed by the teams
- TxDOT letter of commitment where applicable
- Recognition on TxDOT and Texas Innovation Alliance websites
