

NEW TECHNOLOGY INITIATIVE ANNOUNCED AT SPRINGWOOD SCHOOL

Dear Springwood Alumni,

It is my pleasure to announce an exciting new technology initiative, recently approved by the Board of Trustees, which is scheduled to begin this coming fall. Phase I of the plan includes the acquisition of rolling laptop carts that will store 22 laptop computers, enough for every child in a class to use one. These carts, called COWS (Computers on Wheels), will be available for classroom use by students and teachers beginning with the 2007 - 2008 school year.

Our entire next school year will be dedicated to Phase I and will serve to prepare students and faculty for Phase II. During 2007-2008, teachers will participate in training to more fully integrate technology with instruction. The Springwood faculty has been increasing its technology savvy for the past two years; therefore, their transition to full integration of technology should be relatively easy. Springwood's outstanding teachers are the key to the ongoing success of this initiative. They are on track to accomplish great things as the school moves forward. In an effort to provide all the ancillary needs, the school will also continue to add Smart-Boards (electronic white boards) and projectors as well as digital cameras, Vernier Probes for science labs, and printing capabilities.

On another exciting note, our upper level art and technology curricula will be revised for the coming year. Students who take both art and technology will benefit from a fully integrated curriculum that incorporates use of sophisticated graphic arts software to develop tangible projects and allow a variety of display options for student work.

Beginning in August of 2008, Springwood School will move to Phase II which will involve all 9th through 12th grade students using their own tablet computers. All students in 9th through 11th grades will lease or purchase the same model tablet computer which they may use at school, at home, during holidays and during the summers for a three to four year period. For the initial year of the tablet program, 2008-09, lease/purchase of tablet computers will be "optional, but highly recommended" for seniors (Class of 2009).

The tablet computer is the hardware of choice because of its versatility. With its rotating screen, the tablet can be used as a traditional laptop or can be folded flat and used with a stylus for mathematics, geometry, handwritten note-taking, map work, and even drawing. Over time, almost all textbooks will be available in CD-ROM format or through online subscription, and students will be able to significantly lighten, or perhaps eliminate, their heavy backpacks.

Springwood has always been committed to preparing students for college and the work-world beyond. We believe full immersion in technology and full utilization of technology to support learning will better prepare students for the world they will encounter in college and for the remainder of their lives.

The CVEF has carefully taken the time necessary to gauge the academic value of a one-to-one tablet pro-

gram. Ultimately, everyone understands that Springwood students must have the appropriate tools coupled with the school's high expectations and instructional expertise to be well prepared for college and beyond.

These are exciting times for the future of Springwood and for the excellent level of academic preparation we will continue to provide! The faculty and I are eagerly awaiting the return of students in August and the opportunity to begin this exciting two-phase technology initiative.

Springwood Campus Improvements

Do you remember the cemetery at Springwood

School?

Students in Malinda Crowder Powers' 74 sixth grade history class researched and found out that a Confederate veteran, Milton Reese, was buried in the Reese Family Cemetery on the Springwood campus. After the discovery of the unmarked grave, the students contacted the Department of Veteran Affairs about providing a headstone. Markers are provided free of charge for any veteran who served in a U.S. war.

Located a short walk through the woods from the school, the cemetery is kept clean by student volunteers. On Wildcat Workday, juniors from Mr. Nolen's advisory class along with Mrs. Powers cleaned up the cemetery for the headstone dedication ceremony held on April 27, 2007.

The obituary of Milton Reese noted that he was a versatile writer who "expressed his ideas with clearness and force" and that he was a man "of deep convictions and was courageous in the expression of his opinions." Reese died September 23, 1890.

Facilities Renovations

Thanks to our generous PTO, Springwood School is involved in a multi-phase re-organization and renovation of several of its instructional facilities. Phases I and II should be completed prior to the opening of school in August 2007. Without this timely and generous donation from the PTO, the facility plan would have been unable to proceed without conducting a major fundraiser. Also, the CVEF has received a separate, private donation specifically designated for science lab renovations and hopes to proceed with identifying an architect and solidifying plans for the renovation of labs in the very near future.

On May 24th, at Springwood's Honors Day Ceremony, Dr. Drew Ferguson IV was presented the 2007 Distinguished Alumni Award by Alumni Director, Ann Hixon.

He is a graduate of the University of Georgia and the Medical College of Georgia. He is a member of the Western Dental Society where he has held several offices including that of President. He is also a member of the Georgia Dental Assoc. and the American Dental Assoc. Drew and his wife, Buffy live in West Point with their four children, Drew V, Lucy, Mary Parks, and Thad.


Class of 1997












2007 Springwood School Athletic Hall of Fame Nominations:

The Alumni Assoc. needs volunteers to help with Homecoming night activities on Oct. 12th. Please consider donating your time.

The Springwood Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 2004 to recognize lasting athletic achievements of Springwood students. To be eligible for nomination individuals —

- Must have attended Springwood for a minimum of 2 years and lettered in at least 2 sports.
- Must have displayed outstanding athletic performance, team leadership, and individual achievement in sports supported by post-season honors (position as team captain, record-setting performance, district or state recognition, and/or winning an individual championship.)
- Will not be considered until more than fifteen years have passed since their Springwood graduation.

After the initial year, no more than five individuals will be inducted in any one year.

Springwood alumni, as well as faculty, parents, and coaches are invited to submit nominations.
