Advent at Home

JESSE TREE WEEK 1 THE PROMISE OF GOD


The symbols of the Jesse Tree this week represent the Promise of God made to man in the Early World – The Time of Creation to Abraham and Isaac.

November 30 – Creation Symbol- The Earth Scripture – Genesis 1:1-2:3

This symbol reminds us how we all began: from God's desire, with God's breath filling us, and with God reminding us that we are good.

God's word brought light to darkness and creative shape to the formless abyss. May God, who can create worlds out of nothing, recreate our lives and bring light to the darkness of confusion.





December 1 - Adam & Eve Symbol – Apple/Snake Scripture – Genesis 2:4-3:24

This symbol represents the first parents. We are fascinated by this story of our fall into sin – the snake, the apple, the desire to be like God. At the Easter Vigil we proclaim: O happy fault, O necessary sin... that won for us such a great redeemer!

In our first fall from grace lay the seed of our return to eternal bliss. May it teach us to learn from our mistakes.

December 2 – Noah Symbol – Ark/Rainbow Scripture – Genesis 8:21-9:17

This symbol reminds us of Noah's obedience, which saved his family and his world. After the great flood, a rainbow appeared in the sky to remind us of God's everlasting covenant with us.

Sin and grace meet in our lives as God's chosen ones. Our obedience to God will help us navigate the stormy seas of life.



December 3 – Abraham Symbol – Night Sky Scripture – Genesis 12:1-7, 15:1-6, 17:1-8

Abram was given a new name and a new promise: you shall be called Abraham and your descendants shall be more numerous than the stars of the sky. Our father in the faith believed in one God.

Abraham believed in God's promise, and in his faith our own was born. May we, like Abraham, walk with strong faith in God's presence.





December 4 – Isaac Symbol – Ram Scripture – Genesis 22:1-18

Born to aged parents, Isaac nearly became the sacrifice that Abraham was to offer to God. Ever obedient, Abraham is given his son back and God's intention is made clear.

Your eternal covenant, O God is a covenant sealed in the blood of your son. May the God of Abraham and Isaac weep with us when we grieve those we have lost.



MORE Advent at Home

Blessing of Advent Wreath and Daily Prayer for Week 1

Each day your family should gather around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. The proper number of candles are then lighted and a prayer is said.

BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

It starts at the evening meal on the Saturday before the first Sunday in Advent with the blessing of the wreath. The head of the household is designated as the Leader and the candle is lit each night by a designated family member. The following prayer can be used or if you have already had this tradition in your household use what you have used in the past or find a different version online.



Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from You abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water. The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week.

After the prayer, the family's youngest child lights the first purple candle. (Family members can also take turns lighting and blowing out the candles on each night.)

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, That by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.




