He has served as a consulting psychologist for Marquette University performing risk assessments of violence potential for undergraduate and graduate students. Dr. Tyre serves as a Special Consultant Psychologist for the Suburban Critical Incident Team, working directly with the hostage negotiation unit. He also holds a position as an adjunct professor at the Wisconsin School of Professional Psychology (WSPP) teaching courses in correctional psychology, forensic assessment, and has served as the Chair for multiple doctoral dissertations focused in the area of sexual offender risk assessment.
