

STRATEGY FOR COMMUNITY AND PRIVATE SECTOR ENGAGEMENT



$\Delta = f (FR \times CP)$

 Δ = company, investor decision to change

FR = *felt risk*

CP = credible pathway (solution)

Activities that increase sense of felt risk:

- Advocacy
- Campaigns
- Supply chain mapping
- Monitoring


Ex. Communities as Counterparties. 2014.

Activities that support credible pathways:

- Multi-stakeholder dialogues
- Consensus-based tools / guidance
- Capacity building (both sides)
- Monitoring

Ex. <u>Laos – Joint Action on Sust. Tree</u>
<u>Plantations</u>

Private sector has substantial political capital.



CASE: COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING TO ENGAGE COMPANIES AND RECOGNIZE CUSTOMARY RIGHTS IN INDONESIA



State of Play: Talang Parit community are customary landowners in Sumatra. Majority of territory has been cleared for palm oil and forestry concessions. Unable to advance their claims since early 1990's. Key concession agreements (40 year) up for renewal in 2020/2021.



Next Steps in 2022 and beyond?

- Invite buyers to pressure the RSPO, producer company.
- Joint pilot of CBM framework.
- Multistakeholder dialogue to advance collective action (community, local company, buyers, RSPO, district govt.)
- GOAL Engage local government to formally recognize Talang Parit claims.
