## HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER READING PROJECT

- Book genre:** Classic novel from the assigned grade-level Summer Reading List
- Project:** Diorama
- Project grade value:** Bonus 100% test grade for the Quarter 1 Summative average
- Project objective:** To give students the opportunity to earn a test grade using an alternative method to standardized testing; to let students use their creativity to enhance their overall learning experience; to have FUN while reading a classic novel!
- Project assigned:** Summer 2020
- Project due date:** the first day of Fall Semester 2020

### Project requirements:

- 1) Students must choose a novel ***that they have not previously read*** from their grade-level Summer Reading List. *No credit will be given if a student turns in a project for a book not on the approved grade-level list or for a previously read book.*
- 2) Using a regular-sized shoebox, students must create a Diorama reflective of the story's theme, central setting, and main character(s). The lid of the shoebox does not have to be included in the project unless it is decorated as part of the project. One side of the shoebox may be removed for ease of decorating. The entire shoebox must be decorated (no logos, etc., showing).
- 3) Students must include their name, grade, book title, and author's name on one or more sides of the Diorama. ***All information must be typed!*** Students may use any readable font style or ink color(s) for their typed information; font size should be 12-point minimum. (Optional: Students may use stickers or stencils for their "typed" information.)
- 4) Students will be graded on overall neatness and creativity, completion of project requirements, and grade-level appropriateness of their work.
