

Information for employers and employees

You - or someone you know - may have questions about the COVID-19 vaccine and be looking for reliable information from sources you can trust.

You may be looking for tips on how to make the experience of getting the vaccine as comfortable as possible, especially if they, or a family member, is nervous about needles, or answers to common questions about the vaccine.

In Canada, there are a number of credible sources on the vaccine, including IWK Health, Nova Scotia Health Authority, Health Canada, Immunize Canada, and the Canadian Paediatric Society.

The provincial government's Coronavirus website also has lots of information about the COVID-19 vaccine, its safety, and links to information from the sources mentioned above.
