## *Session Two: God's Gospel*

### ANALYZE

In the same way that many people faithfully read the morning paper or turn on the evening news, Christians are eager to hear important news that affects their lives. There is none more important or more relevant than the good news of Christ Himself.

Review Ephesians 6:19 and 2 Corinthians 4:4. What relevance does frequent worship have for the Christian?

Review 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; 1 Corinthians 2:2; Galatians 1:6-8. What benefits may we derive from frequent study of God's Word and sound Christian doctrine?

### APPLICATION

In our sinful world, where good news is so infrequently heard, it is easy to become skeptical about such news or cynical about its content. But our Lord assures us that His Gospel is no sentimental story; it is true, faithfully reported, and eternally relevant. It is good news indeed.

How might you respond to a friend who believes the Gospel is too good to be true?

How might you respond to a friend who believes that the importance of Jesus is found in His moral example rather than in His death and resurrection?
